### Make Cleaning A Success

In the FY 1986-87 budget, the City Council appropriated \$61,215 for Citizen Participation Activities for the Housing and Community Development Program. The six Northeast HCD neighborhoods (Boise, Eliot, Humboldt, King, Sabin and Vernon) were allotted \$15,000 of the monies to carry out their activities.

In August of 1986, the N.E. HCD Neighborhood Associations formed a committee to organize and coordinate a spring clean-up as their CPA project. The committee contracted with Mr. Bob Donaldson to be the N.E. HCD Livability Coordinator.

Mr. Donaldson coordinated the efforts of the Clean-

up Committees from the individual neighborhoods and structured and implemented the project plan.

The Northeast Neighborhoods feel they were able to get more mileage out of the \$15,000 through this joint venture as compared to attempting six separate projects.

The success of this project and the strengthening of the common bond between Neighborhood Associations: To improve the Quality of Life in their Communities, during this project's life will insure more joint projects between Neighborhood Associations in the future.
