Commissioner Bob Koch lent a hand-and a paintbrush-to join in with a work crew from Project Payback to paint playground equipment on a community park at 1906 N.E. Prescott St, Tuesday, July 7, 1987.

Project Payback, co-sponsored by Multnomah County and the Boys and Girls Club of Portland, arranges work for youth to pay back courtordered restitution to victims. The youth are paid \$3.35 an hour, with 60 percent of their wages going to pay back victims.

The community park is on Water Bureau property, and is maintained because of lack of nearby parks for the Sabin neighborhood.

Koch supports the idea behind Project Payback and says the benefits of this particular project are twofold: "Cleaning up the park and helping change young people's attitudes toward crime are both ways to improve neighborhood livability,"

Koch gave a pep talk to summer youth program workers who began their first day of work at 8 a.m. at Water Bureau headquarters at Southeast 60th and Division.

About 80 youth hired through the Portland Private Industry Council will be welcomed to the world of work in painting, landscaping, ground maintenance and repair
