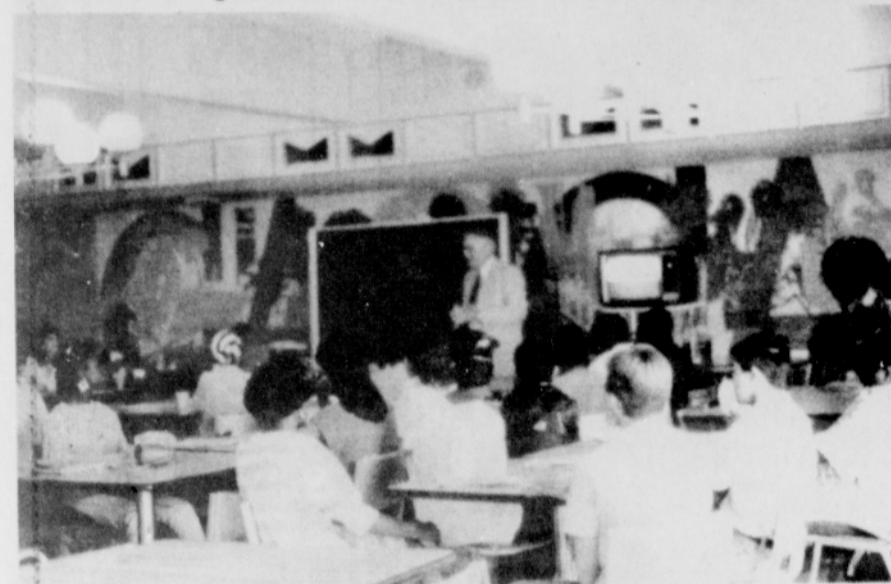

Cascade Campus Hosts Visiting High School Seniors

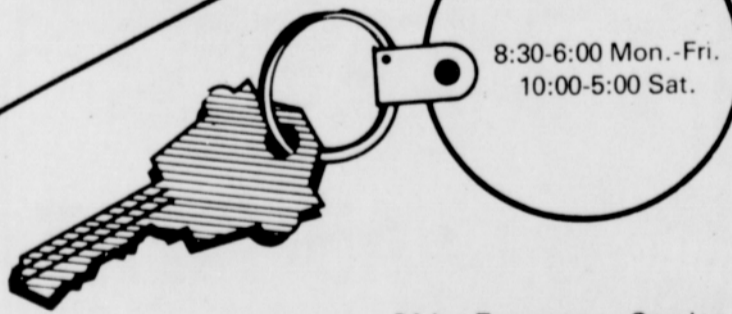

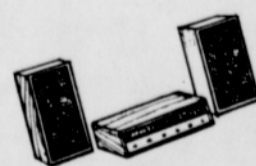
