Fashion Show And Luncheon

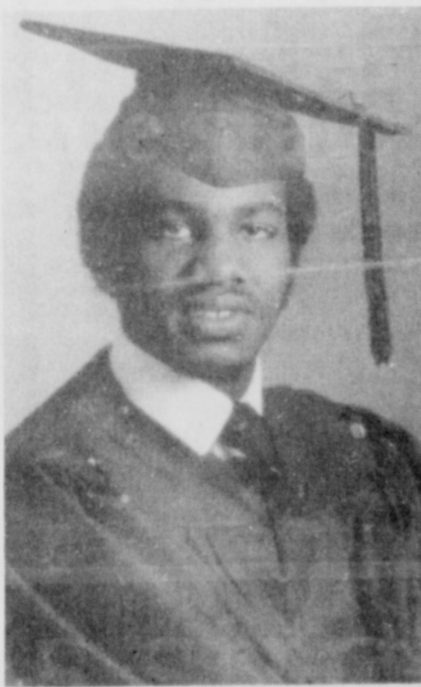

In Remembrance of William Ceaser

Funeral for William B. "Pepper" Ceaser who drowned in an attempt to rescue two boys from the treacherous current of the Columbia River on June 14, was held in the Vann and Vann Funeral Home on June 26.



Ceaser 25, drowned while trying to save his 10 year old nephew, and a 5 year old boy who were on a small rubber raft that was pulled into the current. The boys were rescued moments later by a passing boater. Ceaser's body was found June 24.

Born in New Orleans, Ceaser moved to Portland in 1970. He graduated from Jefferson High School where he excelled in track. Ceaser worked for the Hilton Hotel in Portland as a Banquet Waiter after graduating from high school.

Ceaser is Survived by his parents Betty and William Ceaser of Portland. Also by his four brothers; Roland, Madison, David and Whardell; all of Portland. And by his eight sisters; Joyce, Debra, Eva, Brenda, Donna, Denise, and Betty Jean; all of Portland and Brenda Powell of Slidell Louisiana and by his fiancée Kathy Puderbough.

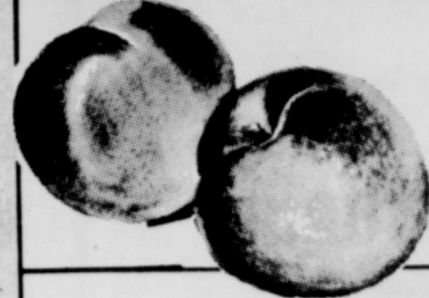
