

Citizens Commission Decries Psychiatric Abuse of Elderly

The Oregon Chapter of Citizens Commission on Human Rights (CCHR) is very actively informing the citizens of our state concerning psychiatric abuses. The groups volunteer staff have canvassed the state passing out information in their efforts to inform Oregonians of the dangerous activities of the psychiatric profession. They recently set up the Psychiatric Abuse Hotline (503-228-3279) in Portland where people can call and report cases of psychiatric abuse such as electric shock, over-drugging, and sexual molestation by psychiatrists. These all too common practices can leave the victims feeling they have nowhere to turn and the CCHR Hotline provides not only a place to turn, but can help a victim of psychiatric abuse document his case for legal action against the psychiatrist involved.

The group is currently informing the public of the danger of Senate Bill 1209, the Medicare Ambulatory Health Services Access Act. This Bill, while appearing to help the elderly citizen by giving more psychiatric treatment, is in fact increasing funding for electric shock "treatment", which ruin the last years of a person's life with permanent brain damage and memory loss. SB1209 allows psychiatrists to perform an unlimited amount of electric shock on elderly women and men and be reimbursed for 80% of the treatment as often as the psychiatrist wants to.

CCHR believes we must safeguard the last years of our parents and grandparents lives and protect them from this psychiatric barbarism. The group urges all citizens to write Senators Mark Hatfield and Bob Packwood, U.S. Senate, Washington, D.C. 20510, urging them to vote against SB1209.

Ghana Finance Minister to Speak at PSU

The Association of African Students at Portland State University is organizing an Economic Development Symposium on Friday, October 23 and Monday, October 26.

Presenters on 10/23/87 12:00-2:00 p.m. will include PSU graduate students and local experts. Topics they will cover include "Regional Development", "The Problem of World Hunger", etc.

A noon speech/lecture on Monday, 10/26/87 will be the symposium highlight. Dr. Kwesi Botchwey, who is a Minister of Finance and Economic Planning from Africa/Ghana and also a consultant to the World Bank in Washington, D.C., will speak on "The Role of the World Bank and Private U.S. Investment in Genuine Economic Development for Africa."

Dr. Kwesi Botchwey is the architect of an economic recovery program that has recorded over 5% annual growth for four years running. He holds a Master's degree in Law from Yale University and a Ph.D. from Michigan. Quoted widely and mentioned in such publications like the Wall Street Journal, Economist, Africa, West Africa, and the Oregonian, Dr. Botchwey can be counted on to give us a very insightful lecture on the situation in most developing countries.

The 10/26/87 speech will be held in the new School of Business Administration Building, Room 19SBA at 12:00 noon.

Contribution of non-perishable food will be collected by volunteers in Portland neighborhoods Saturdays, December 5 and 12.

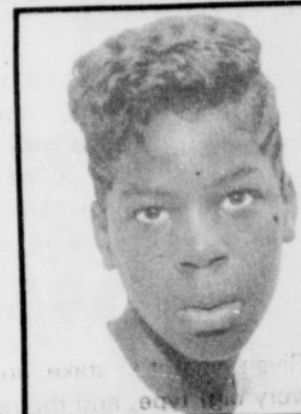
Food will be delivered to needy families Saturday, December 19.
