Rose Festival Navy Cruise Makes Perfect Christmas Gift!

One of the most popular events of the annual Portland Rose Festival is available right now — as a Christmas gift. It's the annual upriver cruise on Navy ships of the Rose Festival fleet.

About 24 ships of the U.S. and Canadian Navies and the U.S. Coast Guard are expected to arrive for the 1988 Rose Festival on June 8 and 9, and local citizens can purchase one-day cruises on the ships from Astoria to downtown Portland.

Three trip packages are offered — Option I is the "Board Only" package for one-way passage on one of the ships from Astoria to Portland, for \$30 per person. Option II is the "Red Eye Trip" which includes bus transportation from Portland to Astoria — leaving Portland about 3 a.m. — and a trip on board a Navy ship, for \$45 per person. The most popular trip — Option III — includes a bus ride from Portland the night before the cruise, dinner and overnight accommodations in Astoria, and a continental breakfast before boarding the ships the next morning. The cost is \$110 per person or \$150 per couple, double occupancy.

The upriver Navy cruise is a unique opportunity to see the Columbia River and the Oregon-Washington shoreline from a completely different perspective during the 8-hour trip. And, the festive greeting in Portland — complete with fireboats spraying water in the air — is a tremendous experience. En route to Portland, passengers are given the opportunity to tour the Navy ships and get a brief taste of shipboard life.

Formal gift certificates from the Rose Festival Association make an excellent Christmas gift — or a special treat for yourself. But, be sure to order early since space is limited.

Cal's at Johns Landing Opens

Cal's at Johns Landing, a new waterfront restaurant at 5310 S.W. Macadam (the site of the former Quinn's Mill Restaurant) opened for business December 1, following extensive renovation.

The restaurant was "launched" at a ceremony December 3 by a champagne swinging Santa who wished the restaurant a successful voyage as he broke the bottle over the front deck railing in true maritime fashion.

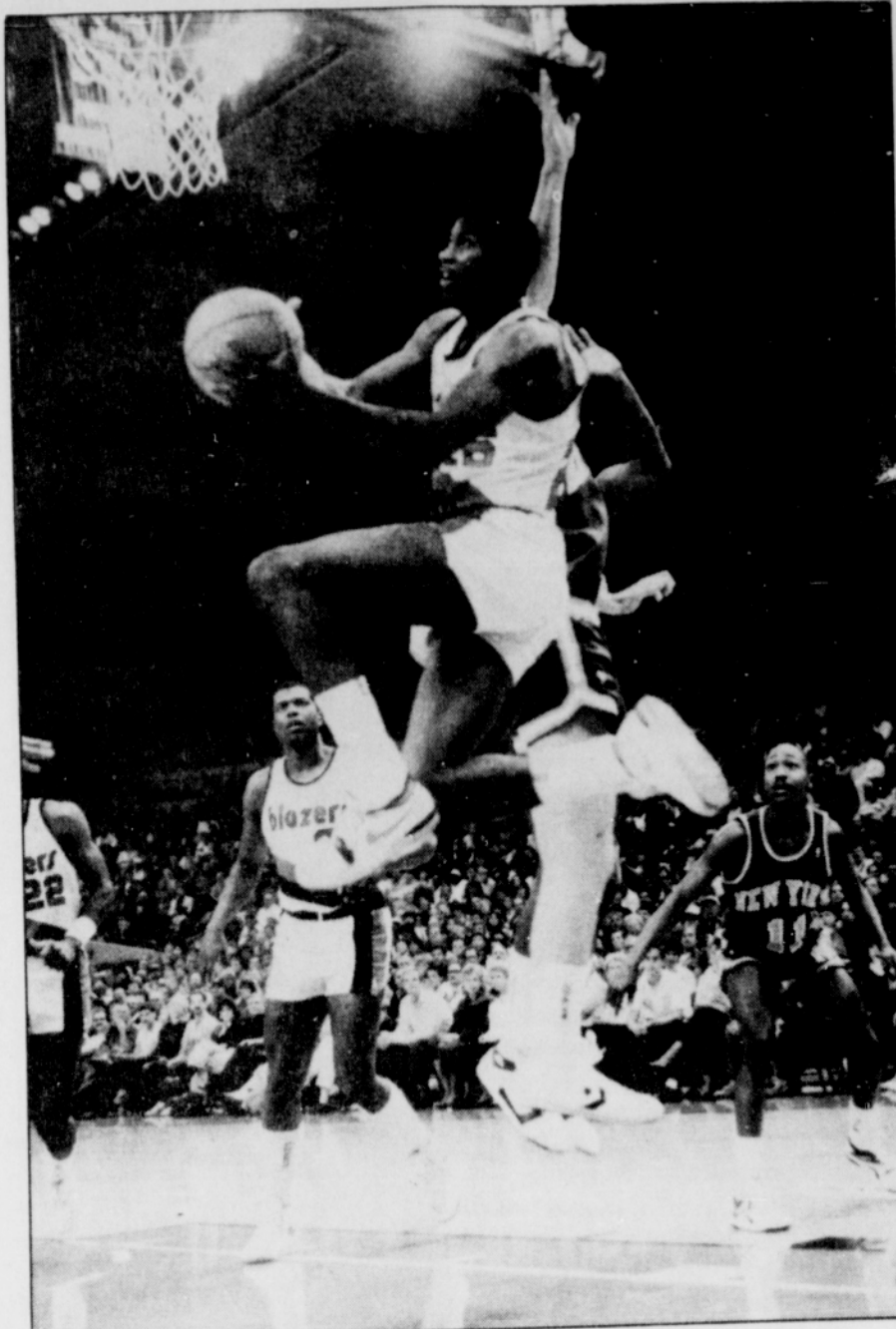
The 160 seat restaurant, which is operated by Hotel Management Associates of Beaverton, serves lunch, dinner and Sunday brunch, with live entertainment seven nights a week. The restaurant has banquet space for 120, 100 seats in the lounge and 100 on the river front deck.

Matthew Elsen is general manager. Cindy Simmons and Brinda Murdock are assistant managers.

The restaurant is open for lunch Monday through Friday from 11:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Dinner is served Monday through Thursday from 5:00 until 10:00 p.m., Friday and Saturday from 5:00 until 11:00 p.m. Sunday brunch is served from 10:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m.

The extensive menu includes a weekly special fresh sheet, as well as a wide assortment of appetizers, soups, salads, burgers and sandwiches, pasta, seafood, meats, poultry and vegetables. Among the house specialties are a salmon burger, baby back pork ribs and the New Orleans style Sunday brunch.

The 45 bottle wine list features eight wines by the glass and two champagnes by the glass. Twenty-four imported and domestic beers are offered, with four beers on tap. A Portland microbrewery will be featured on a rotating basis, as well.

Teen-Agers Scholarship Program Pageant

Over \$40,000 in scholarships will be awarded at the 17th Annual Miss Oregon National Teen-Ager Scholarship program that will be held at Gladstone High School, Gladstone, on June 17, 18, 19, 1988. Contestants will be housed at the Cypress Inn.

Young women must be between the ages of 13 through 18 and are judged on scholastic achievement-leadership, poise-personality, and appearance. There is NO swimsuit competition. Each finalist may, at her option, present a talent or an essay on "What's Right About America."

The Oregon winner will receive a \$1,000 Savings Bond and a two-year tuition scholarship to Oklahoma City University (with provision for renewal) and an all expense paid trip to compete in the national program in Hawaii in August where \$40,000 in CASH scholarships and prizes will be awarded.

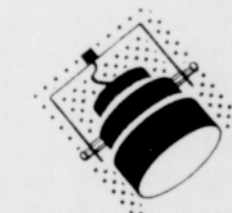
