

Grant Turns on Afterburners For Victory

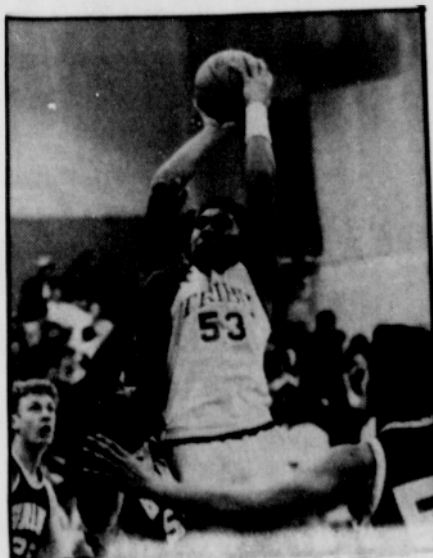
On Friday, January 29th, the Grant Generals squared off with the Indians of Cleveland for what turned out to be a very good showing of what second-half determination can do for a basketball club.

In the first half of play, Grant led by a margin of five points (25-20). With a score so close, it was either team's game. With some good play, Cleveland may have repeated a 53-52 victory attained earlier this season in that classic, 'last minute style'.

With the ending of the half-time festivities, the second portion began.

Grant came off the bench with very crisp passing and well-thought plays.

Six-foot-ten center, Sean Hosey, was instrumental in scoring down low; while guard, James Demry, kept things cooking up top.

Cleveland, on the other hand, was only able to keep up a short while before succumbing to Grant's efforts. Cleveland had many opportunities to rise to beat the Generals,

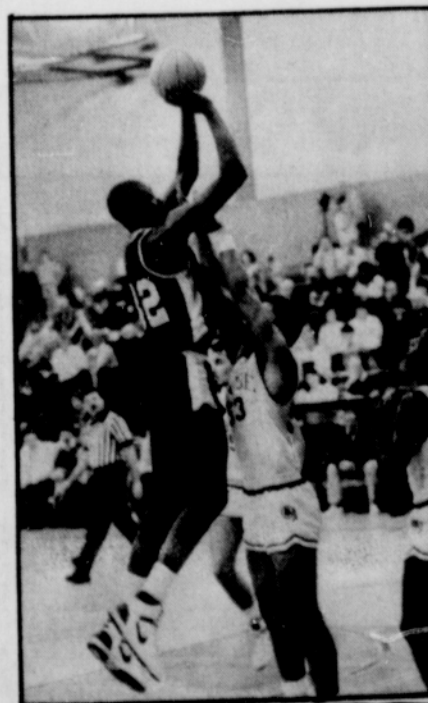
but fell short due to missed shots and consistent turnovers.

Sai Poulivaati (si paul-au-vautee) played quite well, donating 17 points, with a great three-point play; along with Ronald Griggs, who scored nine points. He also grabbed 12 rebounds, including a great full-court drive to the hoop.

In lieu of Cleveland's moments of flickering performance, Grant surged on to victory in great form.

Demry was perhaps the best catalyst for the Generals. He was quite effective in triggering offensive rebounds and defensive boards. He also showed good team leadership. "It was an intense game. We play well when we play as a team," he comments.

Team play was the key phrase in Friday night's victory. It gave Grant the edge in making turnovers into points. Good job, Generals!
