Fred Douglas - "I'm talking to God every chance I get. At one time, all I could dream about was where to get more drugs. Yes, I was in church, but a slave to drugs. Thank God for this church. The old man dies, and you're reborn in Christ. God is in control. Sin is the root of the problem. Scheming, lying, cheating and the rackets in prison are all sins. Let Jesus guide you into perfect peace. I'm so full of Christ - I don't need anything else."

David Bell - once a big time drug dealer on N.E. 15th and Killingsworth. He said, "I have my wife and kids now. I thought that I liked them - but I love them so much now. How can you say that you love someone and steal from them. My children were coming to church with big holes in their shoes. I was taking so much drugs until my speech was slurred. Then the slurring stopped and my brain was gone. I had friends that started trusting me to do responsible things.
