Mayoral Candidate Forum Slated

All Candidates for Mayor of the City of Portland will answer questions on City issues at a forum sponsored by the League of Women Voters of Portland on Tuesday, April 12 at 7:30 p.m. The forum will take place in the Greater Hall of Westminster Presbyterian Church, 1624 NE Hancock Street. The public is invited.

All eleven candidates have accepted the League's invitation. Candidates participating are: Lloyd Anderson, Barry Bloom, J.E. (Bud) Clark, Jim Davis, William J. Doering, Andrew F. Eggleston, Robert Forthan, Jeffery

Liddicoat, Al Salazar, Hon Still and Cliff Walker.

Corinne Paulson, League president, will moderate the forum, which will last approximately 90 minutes. The program will be taped by Rogers Cable Television and will be aired at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, April 13 on Rogers Cable Channel 30. (For repeat broadcasts, see "Cable Choice" magazine.)

Union Avenue Building Slated for Renovation: PDC Loan Approved

A vacant mixed-use building located along the commercial strip of Union Avenue in N.E. Portland will soon undergo renovation using \$109,900 of financial assistance from the Portland Development Commission (PDC).

At its March 9 meeting, PDC approved a request for an Investor Rehabilitation Loan to renovate Union Manor at 2403-09 N.E. Union Avenue in the Eliot Neighborhood. The building, vacant for about two years, contains 18 residential units on the upper two floors, and ground floor commercial space.

Union Manor, Inc., a local corporation established to manage this project, has requested the loan from PDC. Union Manor, Inc., plans to lease the building's residential portion to Providence Hospital for use as transitional housing for mental health pa-

tients. Providence Hospital recently received funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to help meet the housing needs of mental health patients requiring transitional support to achieve independent living.

The Eliot Neighborhood Association has acknowledged the building's future use by Providence Hospital and endorsed this use in a January letter to PDC. Providence Hospital's program for transitional housing requires a resident manager to live on site.

The three principals of Union Manor, Inc., are William Reed, a general contractor (owner/manager of some 200 housing units in NE Portland); Dr. Donald Treistad, a cardiologist; and William Lenz, a construction superintendent.

educated and not miseducated and "trained" like a dog or a monkey. Let's use our MBA's, MSW's and PhD's to change our community and STOP THE KILLING.

Black people must realize that they are getting mis-educated through the school system, media and the mass culture that is marketed especially for Black youth. But at the same time African-Americans must redevelop a thirst, an underlying drive for education!

Black self-education is key. The oppressor's school system must be used to obtain skills needed to survive in a technological world of computer chips. It must become common knowledge for our people that education does not stop with a high school or college degree. We need a generation of parents who can properly teach their children about the realities they will have to face in a racist capitalist country. Black people will have to be well-educated in the technological sciences if they are to remain a viable part of the working class in the 21st century.

There is a great need for Black parent educational centers in every Black community. So essential to the Black underclass' existence is the need-to-know that unless as a race and part of a class become "socially active" to positively change our environment we will go backwards, in social philosophy having a philosophy of cynicism and despair. An oppressed national minority cannot afford to be apathetic and cynical. Unless the Black middle class begins to extend more sustained leadership to Black children and families, all of our Mercedes... will not hide our failure as a generation of 'haves that did not protect the future during our watch."
