## Women/Minority Business Enterprise Program

It is the policy of the Clark County Public Transportation Benefit Area Authority (dba C-TRAN) to encourage Disadvantaged and Women Owned Business Enterprise (DBE/WBE) participation on all C-TRAN projects. Therefore, C-TRAN maintains a DBE/WBE Program based upon Department of Transportation (DOT) Rule 49, CFR, Part 23, and directives of the Urban Mass Transportation Administration (UMTA) Office of Civil Rights.

The overall goal of C-TRAN's DBE/WBE Program is to insure that DBE/WBE's are given the maximum opportunity to participate in all projects. Specifically, C-TRAN is securing a minimum of 12% Disadvantaged Business Enterprise participation and 2% Women-Owned Business Enterprise participation in all procurement opportunities.

The C-TRAN Executive Director is responsible for insuring the success of the DBE/WBE Program in accordance with policy directives of the C-TRAN Board of Directors. The Procurement and Grants Manager, also acting as the DBE/WBE Program Coordinator, is responsible for monitoring the DBE/WBE program, insuring Program compliance with federal and state guidelines, and soliciting DBE/WBE participation in all procurements. All Departmental Directors assume responsibility for DBE/WBE Program compliance within their department.

In addition to the routine purchase of transit coach and facility maintenance supplies. C-TRAN is currently participating in construction of a 3-block Transit Center in Vancouver. Future major projects include construction of a smaller Transit Center and two Park and Ride Lots. DBE/WBE's are welcome and encouraged to apply for C-TRAN certification in order to facilitate participation in any present and future contracting opportunities.
