On Saturday, June 18—directly following the Lesbian and Gay Pride March and Rally here in Portland—a public nominating convention will place my name on the Oregon State ballot as a Presidential candidate.

My independent campaign—a campaign which is a crusade for fair elections and democracy—is about giving all the people of this country a choice in November. I want to pay tribute to the lesbian and gay community here in Portland, which is stepping out to help lead the fight for fairness, inclusion and democracy by insisting that the independent voice has the right to be heard, and that all the people of Oregon have the right to vote for a pro-gay, pro-environmentalist, anti-corporate alternative to the candidates of the two major parties.

## **NAMC to offer Superfund Training**

#### Are you interested in pursuing work in the Hazardous Waste Removal Field?

Each year more than \$850 million worth of minority subcontracting goal requirements established by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency for its "Superfund" Program go unfilled because of an insufficient number of trained minority contractors in the field. The National Association of Minority Contractors has been funded by the Environmental Protection Agency to conduct a series of training workshops for minority contractors in the hazardous waste removal area (under the Superfund program).

#### Who Should Attend?

Firms seeking opportunities in the field of hazardous waste removal and who have had some exposure in related work dealing with hazardous waste removal.

#### What does the training offer?

Three phases of training are being offered at each site. They will be for a duration of one week per course. Training will cover: 1) orientation into Superfund; 2) in-depth safety including on-site use of protective gear; and 3) training in Federal contract requirements.

### Where will the training be offered?

The selected sites are New York, New York; Cleveland, Ohio; Dallas, Texas; and Los Angeles, California.

#### When will the training start?

The first training sessions will take place in: New York City, April 5-7 1988. Cleveland, Ohio, April 26-28, 1988; Dallas, TX, May 17-19; and Los Angeles, CA, June 7-9.
