

Bethel Shall Never Forget Rev. Akers

Bethel AME Church began as a small group in the home of Brother Phillip Jenkins in the year 1889, here in the city of Portland.

The first pastor, Rev. S.S. Freeman, came from Pasadena, California and served from 1889 to 1901, the year President William McKinley was killed. This information was recalled and contributed by the daughter of Rev. Freeman, Mrs. Clifford Dixon.

The church moved several times, but, the move to North Larrabee and McMillen Streets was a memorable day in the history of the church. It was there that a basement was built in 1915 where the congregation worshipped until the second floor sancturary was added in 1922.

The inevitable push of progress has again dictated a move of the church. For members of the congregation who remember the pride and the joy of building their own church, the future holds a challenge. They look to God to find a way that will somehow weld the sentimental ties of the

In 1959 the present edifice was completed under the pastorate of the Reverend Harley Akers, who served the congregation from 1954 until 1962. The approximate cost of the present building and grounds was \$150,000.

In a memo from the Rev. Akers to his congregation, he wrote: "For four and one-half (4-1/2) years we have been happily associated with this congregation. Each year the association has grown stronger with our mutual christian thoughts and desires. We are truly a blessed people as we stand on the threshold of entering a new house of worship, dedicated to God and to service of His people."

"This accomplishment has not been an altogether an easy one and there are yet many tasks assigned to all our hearts and hands. Yet our faith is undaunted, our determination secure and our togetherness absolute."

The progress of any community is dependent of the incentive of its citizenry. IT was with this thought in mind that the congregation of Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church looked into the future and decided to construct a modern church with educational wing to care for the religious needs of the community of which it is an integral part.

The new Bethel - hurried along because the old building had to be razed to make room for Portland's Exposition-Recreation Center - will be modern in every respect.

The congregation received \$75,000 for the sale of the brick edifice at North Larrabee Avenue and McMillan Streets. The new building will include a sanctuary which will seat 425, a balcony which will seat 25 and a choir loft

which will seat 50. Also, included will be 10 classrooms for the religious education department, one large multi-purpose room, two large multi-purpose room two church offices, stewardness preparation room, sound-proof nursery or crying room, and dressing rooms for the choirs.

The new church is being built on Northesast 8th Avenue, between Jarrett and Simpson Streets, and will be dedicated in the Summer of 1959. [Information received from the office of Bethel AME Church.]

On Thursday, the 2nd of June, 1988, the Rev. Harley H. Akers passed on into eternal glory. He has passed on to a building not made by hands.
