

Free Meals

An estimated 10,000 Oregon children, including 4,000 migrants, will receive free meals during the summer at 85 locations, including schools, parks, churches, and camps.

The program, funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, provides meals to needy children, but any child under the age of 18 may have a free meal at most locations. The only exceptions are summer camps and Upward Bound activities.

Most meals will be lunches, but some sites will provide up to four meals, including snacks.

The local sponsors in Multnomah County are YMCA Camp Collins, Gresham; Portland School District; The Salvation Army, Portland.

Meals will be served free at Upward Bound and summer camps only to children from a household whose income is at or below these levels:

Application forms are being sent to all homes by summer

camps and Upward Bound. Information provided on the application will be used to determine eligibility and may be verified at any time during the year.

For officials to determine eligibility, households receiving food stamps or AFDC must list the child's name, their food stamp or AFDC case number, and the signature and name of an adult household member. Households not receiving food stamps or AFDC must list names of all household members; Social Security numbers of all adult household members or a statement that the household member does not possess one; total household income and the amount and source of the income received by each household member, and the signature of an adult household member certifying that the information is correct.

In certain cases, foster children are also eligible for meal benefits. Household wishing to apply for benefits for foster children should contact sponsors for more information. Information households provide will be kept confidential and used only to determine eligibility for meals and verification.

No child will be discriminated against because of race, color, sex, national origin, age or handicap. If any member of a household believes he or she has been discriminated against, he or she should write to the Secretary of Agriculture, Washington, D.C. 20250.

All services and activities will be held at Metropolitan Community Church, 24th and N.E. Broadway, Portland.

Musical Weekend Planned

About 1,800 needy children, senior citizens and music students will spend a week for as little as \$10 at The Salvation Army's Camp Kuratli at Trestle Glen this summer.

Located 22 miles southeast of Portland, the camp provides 120 acres of wooded slopes, two heated swimming pools, a giant activity center, and outdoor and indoor sports. Following a \$2.5 million renovation, Camp Kuratli is recognized as one of the finest residential facilities in the state.

The campers will come from communities throughout Oregon and southern Idaho. About 450 will come from the Portland Tri-County area.

The campers will have a chance — many for the first time ever — to experience nature, learn new skills and get along with others.

Community service camps will take place during the weeks of June 28 - July 4; July 12 - 18; August 2 - 8; August 16 - 22; and August 23 - 29. A music camp will take place July 21 - 31.

People who wish to help send a needy child to camp can make a \$100 tax-deductible contribution to The Salvation Army.

Grants Announced

State grants for separate programs serving low-income pre-schoolers and providing educational support to parents were announced June 8, by State School Supt. Verne A. Duncan.

Eleven agencies will receive a total of \$1,067,189. in State Pre-kindergarten grants which will provide comprehensive health, social and educational services to low-income pre-schoolers to increase the likelihood of their success in school.

Albina Ministerial Alliance of Portland, received \$70,000; Clackamas County Children's Commission, Oregon City - \$119,996; Clackamas Education Service District, Marylhurst - \$76,670; Family Head Start, Salem - \$80,381; Klamath Head Start, Klamath Falls - \$119,999; Malheur County Child Development Center, Ontario - \$56,827; Mt. Hood Community College and Centennial School District, Portland - \$112,582; Oregon State University, Corvallis - \$26,628; Southwest Community Action (Curry County), North Bend - \$185,160; Umatilla/Morrow County Head Start, Pendleton - \$170,946; Washington County Community Action, Hillsboro - \$48,000.

Three agencies will receive a total of \$266,797 in "Together for Children" grants which will provide educational support to parents of "at-risk" children between the ages of birth and eight years.

They are Birth to Three, Eugene - \$56,354; Central Oregon Community College, Bend - \$143,575, and Crisis Intervention (Jackson County), Medford, \$66,868.

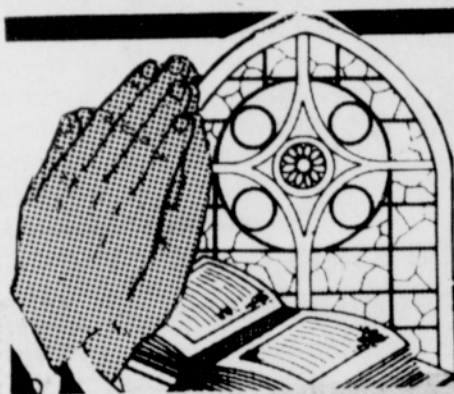
The public is cordially invited to attend the 'Musical Celebration' which is being sponsored by the People to People Ministries.

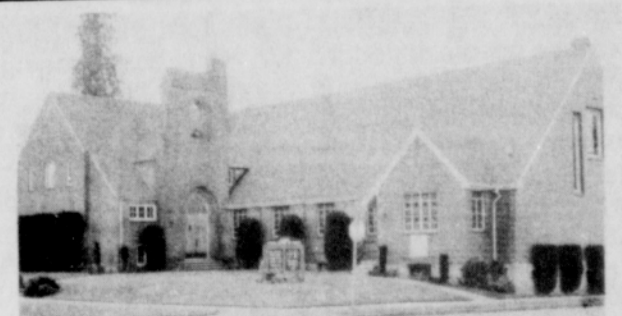
