'Friendship Unlimited' Needs Support

Approximately seven years ago, Rev. and Mrs. Paul Salgado and their three children sought to find a way to minister to persons less fortunate than themselves.

They saw what was taking place in the city of Portland but mainly in the North, Northeast and Southeast areas—where the low income and the socio-economically deprived seemed to be stymied by their fate.

A place to execute this plan was needed; so, a three (3) story house—with its equity donated—was offered to them. The house was built in 1912 and constantly in need of work. It was ideal.

The third floor was reserved solely for the occupancy of five destitute females.

Rev. and Mrs. Salgado have 30, 60 to 90 days in which to work with each female who is placed in their care; before their release.

They work with females on drugs or are practicing prostitutes. They have received women from correctional institutions, from probation centers and directly from the street.

The women are taught how to handle their finances, how to budget, and child care. Not only are their physical and mental needs met; but, their spiritual needs—as well.

This year the Friendship Unlimited outreach ministry are extending the program to women with children. "There is a great need for the women (with their children) in the correctional institutional systems to have a family oriented program that will minister to their needs after they have been released," says Mrs. Jessie Salgado. Also, there are many prostitutes who no longer want to be involved in the "street walking" business; who have not 1 child—but—several.

The program assists the women in getting their children back. Usually the women have their children; but, there are some whose children are in foster homes. They must attend parenting classes for a required period. They are allowed to visit their children in the foster homes—once a week.

The Friendship Unlimited program tries to create a home environment for each family housed in the facility. Each woman and her children have access to the kitchen, living room, and washing facilities. Mrs. Salgado says "We encourage them to cook their own meals."

There is a check-in and a check-out time. There is 24-hour supervision. The daily schedule starts at 7:00 a.m. each morning and lights-out is 11:00 p.m. each night. There are trained volunteers who assist by talking to the women on a 1-to-1 basis.

"We only have room for 5 women and we would like to expand; but, we want it to be a safe home" says Mrs. Salgado.

The Salgado family, also, reside in the facility. They occupy the second floor ... along with other staff members.

Mike Salgado, their 14 year old son, will be attending Benson High School next year. "It has not been easy for him; but, he is pretty stable and he's strong" says Mrs. Salgado. "He plays baseball and works in the summer. He keeps busy. He's learned quite a bit—I'm sure."

The other 2 Salgado children: their daughter, Marcine, now 23 years old and married with a child of her own on the way—was there when they began the program; Anthony, 22 years old, is employed at the Safeway Warehouse in Clackamas and lives in Gresham. He, too, was at home when the facility was begun.

Comments From The Women:
"I've never been in a family that functioned as a family."

"I can't hide from them."
"It's easy for me to talk about my past life."

"I can see how a family functions successfully by watching Rev. and Mrs. Salgado."

The program functions on a non-profit basis. It needs the community's support. There are items that are needed, NOW: clothing (all sizes for the women), towels, foods, toiletries, bed sheets (twin), and children's clothing (infant to 12 years old for girls and boys).

The goals of Friendship Unlimited is: (1) to treat each person with dignity and respect. (2) to tell them to "Never Give Up!" (3) to remember that no one is ever turned away. (4) to always have hope. (5) to know that we love them—but—God loves them also.
