On July 2, 1964, a son was born to Edward and Jean Washington. He was named Keith Edward Washington.

When Keith was about eight years old he loved to watch airplanes. His dad would take him to watch the planes take-off and land. His comment was, "When I get big I am going to fly. Just like that." as he was pointing up to the huge aircraft about to land. At the age of 16 he began his flying lessons. He was able to solo a plane, all by himself, soon after his first lesson. When he became seventeen he was eligible to obtain his private pilot's license.

During the next few years, he spent the majority of his time in Eugene where he began working on his instrument rating and a commercial pilots license. He

received the instrument rating late in 1985 and the commercial license in the early part of 1986. About a month after he had received his commercial license, he received his Flight Instructor Certificate and began his first commercial job as a flight instructor. He continued to teach others to fly, as well as flying charter, some fire patrol, and cargo hauling.

In February of 1988, he received a call from the leading regional airline in the Northwest, Horizon Air. He was asked to join their Flight Department.

Keith is currently flying the line and is expecting to upgrade to captain within a year and a half.

Keith attended and graduated from Benson Polytechnic High School. His subject emphasis was concentrated in aviation technology and electronics. He graduated from Benson in 1982 and entered the University of Oregon in Eugene, Oregon, the following fall. He completed three years of a four degree program with a selected major of Economics with an emphasis on the micro economy. He opted to wait on completing the fourth year so that he could pursue his present occupation as an airline pilot.

One never knows, you may be travelling one day and when you board the plane. Buckle up. Listen to the flight instructions. You may hear a very pleasant voice coming through the intercom saying, "Hello, I am your pilot—Keith Washington..."

### Support For South African Sanctions Urged

PITTSBURGH(UMNS) — United Methodist Bishop James Mase Ault, president of the church's international missions agency, July 26 urged all members of the U.S. House of Representatives to support a comprehensive economic sanctions bill against the apartheid government of South Africa.

"Sanctions will work," Bishop Ault said in his letter. He cited a study by a "conservative" West German institute that the bishop said "makes clear that sanctions applied by the United States, Great Britain, France, West Germany, Switzerland and Japan would break apartheid."

**Bishop Vinton R. Anderson**

**Mrs. Vivienne Anderson**

The 97th session of the General Conference has assigned Bishop Vinton Randolph Anderson to preside in the Fifth Episcopal District.

A resident of St. Louis, Missouri, he and his wife, Vivienne, are the parents of four sons: Vinton Jr., Jeffery, Carlton and Kenneth.

Bishop Vinton served his church as the Presiding Bishop and Chief Pastor in Alabama, 1972-1976, Ohio, West Virginia, Western Pennsylvania, 1976-1984. He is the immediate past Chairman of Wilberforce University Board of Trustees and from 1984-1988 served as Director of the Office of Ecumenical Relations and Development of the African Methodist Episcopal Church. Other responsibilities included Chairman of the Bicentennial Committee and Chairman of the General Conference Commission.

Bishop Anderson, born in Somerset, Bermuda, first came to the United States in 1947 to study at Wilberforce University and Payne Theological Seminary. Graduating in 1952, he received the Bachelor of Arts and Master of Divinity degrees with honor. In 1962, he earned his Masters of Arts degree in Philosophy from Kansas University and the same year did continuing education at Yale University Divinity School.
