In accordance with the implementation of (Subpart D of) Section 106(c) of the Surface Transportation and Uniform Relocation Assistance Act (STURRA) of 1987, each recipient state is required to submit its overall goals to the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Urban Mass Transportation Administration (UMTA) before the beginning of the new federal fiscal year October 1.

Additionally, the FHWA and UMTA require each state receiving federal highway funds to publish a notice announcing these goals; this notice to be available for inspection 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) for not less than 30 days.
