A Long **Awaited First**

ecently appointed the archbishop of the Catholic Archdiocese of Atlanta, prelate Eugene A. Marino makes history as the first Black Catholic archbishop in the United States, reports the October Ebony.



Archbishop Marino, 54, who served for 13 years as an auxiliary bishop in Washington, D.C. before his historic appointment this year, reveals that his Papal appointment was made promptly after a group of Black representation in the church's hierarchy. "I felt amazed, shocked, delighted and deeply honored," says Archbishop Marino. "It was a special feeling, like Jackie Robinson must have felt as the first Black professional baseball player, and how other minority persons must have felt when they were the first in their fields," he adds.

A native of Biloxi, Mississippi, Archbishop Marino has emerged as only the fourth prelate to head the 32-year-old Church of Atlanta, a growing jurisdiction that numbers nearly 10,000 Blacks among its 156,000 parishioners. Though their numbers are few today, he is all the more optimistic about the future prospects of Black involvement with the church. "I would not be a Catholic today if I did not think the Catholic church had something to offer Black people," he says.

MANAMAN MANAMA **Associate Dean To Speak At Conference**

The Reverend Tyrone L. Crider will be the luncheon speaker at the up-coming Black Colleges Conference, October 22, 1988 from 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. at the Coliseum.

Memorial Reverend Crider was born in Chicago, Illinois on January 6, 1959 to Charles and Bernice Crider of Maywood, Illinois. He graduated from Walther Lutheran High School where his athletic ability in football and basketball earned him a place in the State of Illinois Hall of Fame.

In 1977, he entered Morehouse College in Atlanta, Georgia, the alma mater of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., It was because of his belief in the teachings of Dr. King that he enrolled at Morehouse.

While attending Morehouse, Rev. Crider played for the varsity basketball team, joined the campus Crusade For Christ, served as President of the student body for two years, and was on the Dean's list for six semesters.

Upon graduation from Morehouse in 1982, he was asked by the Rev. Jesse Jackson to become the National Youth Director of Push For Excellence. After a year of service in this position, he was appointed as National Director of the Push For Excellence Program. In 1984, he resigned from this position to become the National Youth Director and National Director for voter registration of the historic Jesse Jackson for President Campaign.

Reverend Crider, at the age of 29, has traveled to 30 states in this nation. He has also traveled abroad to Paris, France; London, England; Frankfurt, Germany; Warsaw, Poland; The United Arab Emirates: Kuwait: Quatar: Abu Dubai; and in November 1984, he preached at the Moscow Baptist Church in Moscow - Union of Soviet Socialist Republics.

He is listed in the 1984 edition of Outstanding Young Men of America and was named by Ebony Magazine as one of the Outstanding Leaders of the future.

From 1984-1984, Rev. Crider served as the Director of Admissions of Central State University in Wilberforce, Ohio. In November of 1987, he became the National Coordinator of Ministers for the Jesse Jackson Campaign.

Currently, Rev. Crider serves as a national board member of Push For Excellence, Inc.; is President of the Ohio Council For The Advancement Of Black Students In Education; is Associate Dean of Students at Central State University; is a member of the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc., is National President of The Young Adults For A Better World and serves as Assistant Pastor of the Second Baptist Church of Columbus,




