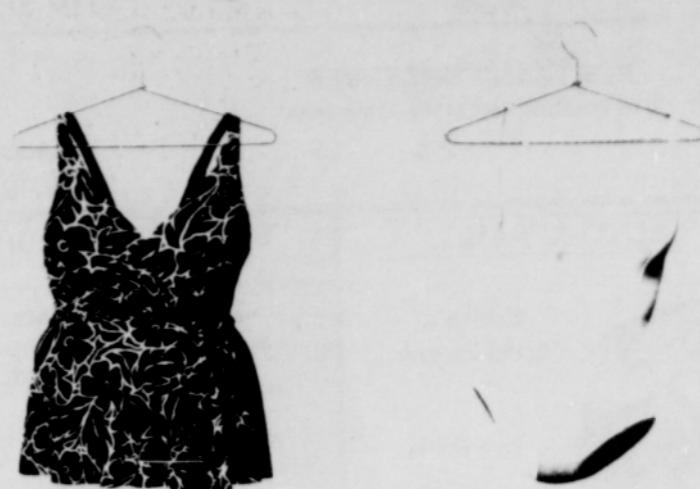
Ronald Williams has been promoted to senior vice president of marketing and corporate services for Blue Cross of California, according to an announcement by Leonard D. Schaefer, president.
