YOUR TAX PERSPECTIVE is a series of questions and answers about Federal and State taxes provided as a courtesy to Oregonians by the Oregon Association of Public Accountants.

ON YOUR FEDERAL RETURN

Q: My doctor suggested an over-the-counter medicine. Is it a deductible medical expense?

A: Probably not. Except for insulin and diabetic supplies, only medications prescribed by a physician in writing are deductible.

Q: I paid \$700 in interest in 1988 on my credit card balances for various personal expenditures. Is that interest fully deductible?

A: If the interest expense resulted from the purchase of personal items (such as items used at home), ONLY 40% of the personal interest can be deducted in 1988 as an itemized deduction on your tax return. The percentage drops to 20% in 1989 and disappears in 1991.

ABOUT YOUR OREGON TAXES Q: What are the "subtractions" only Oregon Form 40 individual tax

return?

A: They are items on which you must pay Federal, but Not Oregon, taxes. For instance, on your Oregon tax form you can subtract your 1988 Federal tax (up to \$3,000 on a joint return; \$1,500 if married and filing separately); Social Security tax shown on line 21b of your Federal Form 1040; any Oregon tax refund shown on your Federal return (does NOT include a property tx refund); up to \$5,000 in U.S. public retirement income and up to \$3,000 in military active duty pay...

Q: My daughter and I and my sister share an apartment. Sis and I split expenses and rent. Neither of us makes more than \$15,000 a year.

How do we claim an Oregon rent refund? A: Each of you must file a separate Form 70R. Your refund will be based on your individual income. You need to list her name, and she yours, on your returns. Do not list your daughter if she didn't pay rent. For free referral to a qualified public accountant or tax consultant in business
