Contractor for this work shall furnish all labor at current State of Oregon prevailing wage rates, materials and equipment and services of all kinds to complete the work in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor.

Plans and specifications may be examined at the office of the Gresham City Engineer, 1333 N.W. Eastman Parkway, Gresham, Oregon. Copies of said plans and specifications may be obtained upon application to the City Engineer and by posting a non-refundable fee of \$25.00 with the City Engineer for each set of plans and specifications requested.

Contractors must prequalify for public works construction with the City of Gresham, as required by the laws of the State of Oregon, before the date of a bid opening. Otherwise, their proposal may not be given consideration.

All proposals must be submitted on the regular forms furnished by the City of Gresham, addressed and mailed or delivered to the Engineering Division, City of Gresham, in a sealed envelope plainly marked, "SEALED BID ON N.W. MILLER AVENUE STORM DRAIN PROJECT" bearing the name and address of the bidder. Each must be accompanied by a certified check, cashier's or bid bond in an amount not less than ten percent (10%) of the total bid. A performance and payment corporate surety bond in the full amount of the contract shall be required to guarantee faithful performance of the terms of the contract at the time of contract execution.

Each bid must contain a statement as to whether the bidder is a resident bidder, as defined in ORS 279.029.

In determining the lowest responsible bidder, the public contracting agency shall, for the purpose of awarding the contract, add a percent increase on the bid of a nonresident bidder equal to the percent, if any, of the preference given to that bidder in the state in which the bidder resides.

YOUR TAX PERSPECTIVE is a series of questions and answers about Federal and State taxes provided as a courtesy to Oregonians by the Oregon Association of Public Accountants.

ON YOUR FEDERAL RETURN
Q: My doctor suggested an over-the-counter medicine. Is it a deductible medical expense?

A: Probably not. Except for insulin and diabetic supplies, only medications prescribed by a physician in writing are deductible.

Q: I paid \$700 in interest in 1988 on my credit card balances for various personal expenditures. Is that interest fully deductible?

A: If the interest expense resulted from the purchase of personal items (such as items used at home), ONLY 40% of the personal interest can be deducted in 1988 as an itemized deduction on your tax return. The percentage drops to 20% in 1989 and disappears in 1991.
