On May 17, 1792, two dozen merchants and brokers agreed to establish what is now known as the New York Stock Exchange. What is now commonly called the "Big Board" was founded as a way for members to charge commissions for acting as agents for other persons and to give preference to each other in their business dealings.

In fair weather, the original traders conducted much of their business under a buttonwood tree at 68 Wall St. In bad weather, they moved to the shelter of a coffeehouse. ll

**BLACK UNITED FUND TO MANAGE COMBINED FEDERAL CAMPAIGN**

The Black United Fund of New York (BUFNY) announced today that it has been unanimously selected by the New York Federal Executive Board to serve as the Principal Combined Fund Organization (PCFO), Campaign Manager, for the 1989/90 New York City Combined Federal Campaign (CFC). The combined Federal Campaign is the one time annual solicitation of approximately 73,000 Federal Employees in New York City area. The CFC came into existence by executive order 10728 signed by President Eisenhower, September 6, 1957 which consolidated fundraising among Federal Government employees, military and civilian.

The selection of the Black United Fund of New York marks another milestone in the eligibility of non-traditional agencies to participate in the management of this campaign. In the past, in order for an agency to establish eligibility to participate in the campaign, it had to be a member agency of the United Way, which had been given

exclusive authority to manage and distribute funds. However, Federal Judge Barrington Parker ruled on July 1, 1980 in the case of National Black United Way, that the National Black United Fund was eligible for participation. This decision eventually opened the campaign drive to thousands of organizations other than the United Way.

The New York City Combined Federal Campaign which raised 1.8 million dollars last year includes independent agencies and major federations such as the United Way, National Health Agencies, International Service Agencies, the National Service Agency and the Black United Fund of New York.

Kermit Eady President of BUFNY said, "We are obviously elated at being selected. BUFNY has always been committed to raising funds for worthy charities, and this is a tremendous boost and an endorsement of our efforts". Eady further stated that he invites the

assist BUFNY in raising dollars to provide services ranging from AIDS and cancer research to housing for the homeless and those of marginal income.

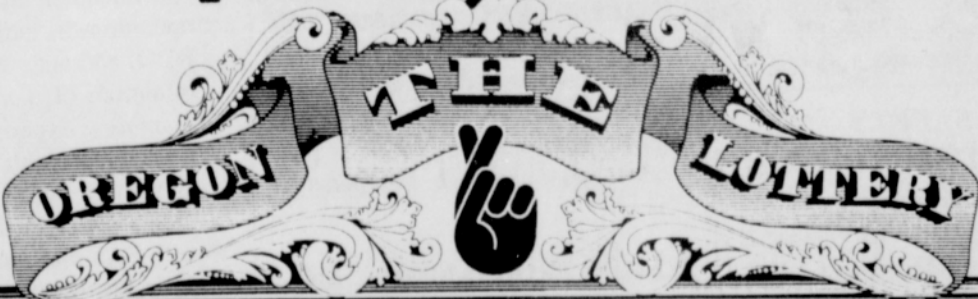
Why waste the night
