QUESTION: Shall Oregon Constitution be amended to establish new tax base limits on schools?	
Beginning in 1990, gives a school district a tax base equal to: (1) any one of the district's operating levies in the prior three years plus six percent, or (2) for two-year safety net districts, the district's 1989 operating levy plus 12.36 percent, or (3) the operating levy approved by the district's local voters for 1990, if approved by July 1, 1989, Permits merging school districts to form new tax base limit by combining their existing tax base limits. ESTIMATE OF FINANCIAL EFFECT: These changes to the Oregon Constitution have no fiscal effect on state government because the state does not levy a property tax. However, the 1989 Legislature has passed other laws that will take effect only if this measure passes. These laws would spend state General Funds in the next two years as follows:
