December 10, 1913-September 13, 1989

Services were held on Saturday, September 16, 1989 at 10:00 a.m. at the Hughes Memorial Methodist Church for Wiley Grant Carter who was born 12/10/13 in Sheeplo, Mississippi to the parents of Elijah and Viola Carter. He united with the Hughes Memorial Methodist Church where he served as a faithful member for many years. His wife, Rosa, preceded him in death in 1986.

Mr. Carter leaves behind a legacy of LOVE and will be remembered by all those whose lives he touched. All of the young people from "G" Street (Gantenbein), who are now all grown up, will surely remember his wise instructions and the 'grapevine', that he tended and loved so much. He had no qualms about reprimanding the children of the neighborhood. He was overwhelmingly recognized as the father figure to 35 or 40 youngsters, who shall never forget his love and his teachings. MALACO RECORDS SINGS BOBBY JONES: Gospel singer and personality Bobby Jones whose TV show, "The Bobby Jones Show" airs weekly on Black Entertainment Television just recently inked a recording deal with Malaco Records. Malaco is touting the recent signing as a major coup, and is hoping the acquisition will lend more of a contemporary flair to the label, which has long specialized in traditional-style gospel. Bobby Jones and his New Life group are expected to release their first album somewhere around the first of the year. In other recording news, **Keith Pringle is also heading for the studio**, but this time without the Pentecostal Choir. His next solo project is due in January.

THINGS DON'T LOOK GOOD

FOR BAKKER: Now that PTL founder Jim Bakker has been competent enough to stand trail, legal analysts say there's no way for him to win the case. Bakker's defense is hoping the court will find that he had no criminal intent and left the financial decisions to others, but in fact, key witness Steve Nelson testified of telling Bakker that someone could go to jail for what they were doing. However, the most damaging evidence against Bakker is the guilty plea of Richard Dortch (the PTL's second -in -command) to charges of fraud and conspiracy. Dortch was fined \$200,000 and sentenced to eight years in prison for his part in defrauding PTL followers of more than 3.7 million. If convicted, Bakker could be fined up to \$5 million and sentenced to 120 years in prison.

NEWS FROM BEREAN

Over eighty Christian teachers and church workers gathered at Berean Baptist Church last Friday, Sept. 15th, and Saturday, Sept. 16th, for the Seventh Annual Inter-Church Christian Education Conference. Plenary sessions and eight workshops developed the theme "God's Church on the Move," emphasizing Christian outreach in the face of serious problems facing our community today.

The Friday evening session was presented by Portland Police officer Dorothy Elmore of the Gang Enforcement Team. Her session, "Drugs, Gangs, the Church and You," explored the various youth gangs found in Portland, including skinheads, Asian

youth gangs, and local manifestations of Crips and Bloods, and she gave guidelines for dealing with gang violence and drug dealing in our community.

On Saturday morning, Missionary Patricia Thomas of Christ Memorial Church explained the ministry of JADA (Jesus Against Drugs and Alcohol), and shared many examples of successful treatment through this Christ-centered outreach. Thomas's personal testimony of deliverance from substance abuse was very moving for the assembled participants.
