

Students At Black Colleges Win Foundation Scholarships

NEW YORK--Twelve students at five predominantly black colleges have been named winners of Metropolitan Life Foundation Future Teacher Scholarships. All 12 are entering their junior or senior years in college.

This is the fourth year that the foundation has awarded scholarships to stu-

dents attending historically black colleges. The winners are chosen competitively for their academic ability and commitment to the teaching profession.

"Pollster Lon Harris reported in a 1988 Met Life teacher survey that most (67%) minority teachers agree that in-

creasing minority presence in the profession is very important," said Sibyl Jacobson, president and chief executive officer of the Metropolitan Life Foundation. "We hope that these Future Teacher Scholarships provide students with an added incentive to persist in pursuing teaching careers."

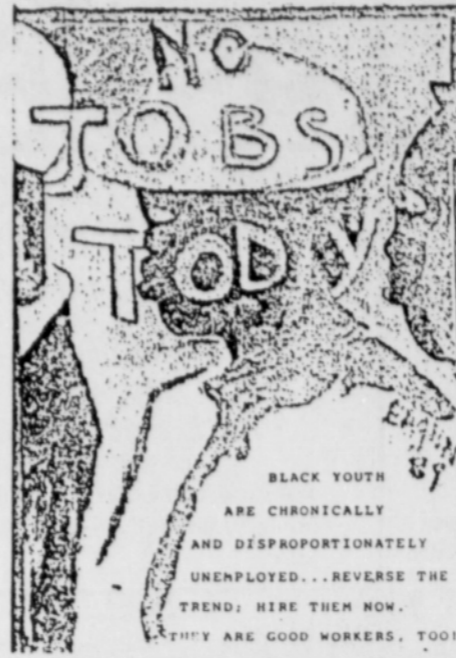
The scholarship program is administered by Citizens' Scholarship Foundation of America, Inc., a national, non-profit scholarship organization in St. Peter, Minn.

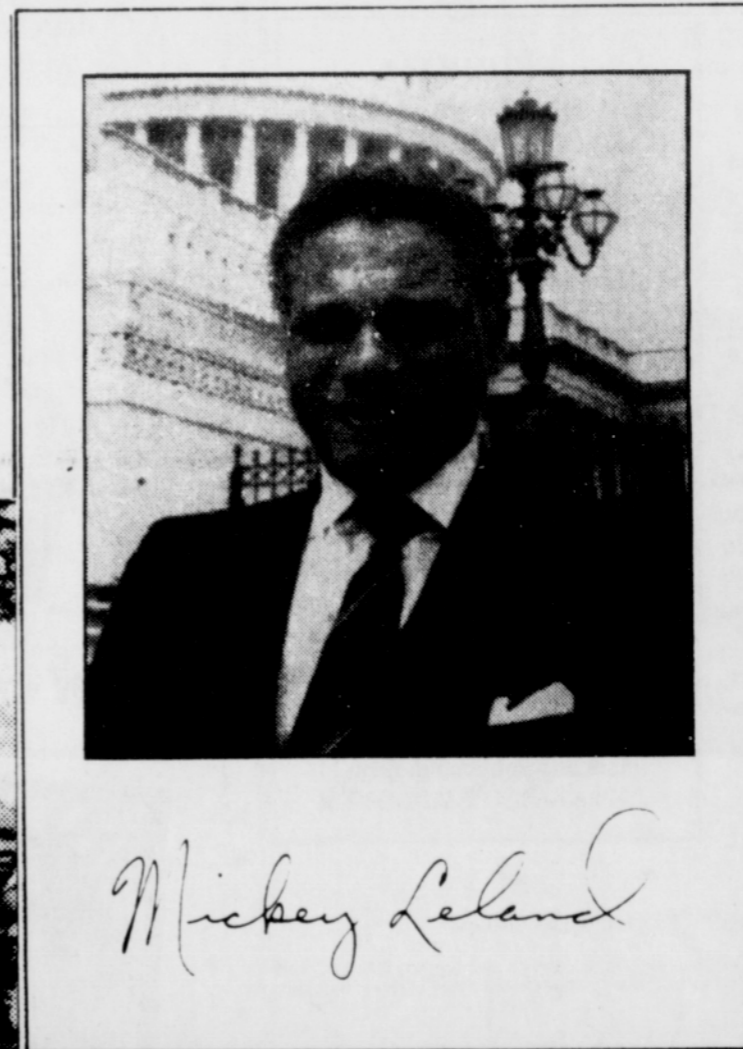
