

Vikings Gain Share Of Conference Crown

In a do or die test Saturday night the Vikings soundly trounced Sacramento State, the other contender for the conference title. The win insured Portland State at least a tie for Western Football Conference championship. A result of Saturday's contest was that the Vikings moved up the national ranking to 16th rated of NCAA Division I-AA teams.

The Vikings drew first blood on a fan called play, (which was their first from scrimmage) on an 80 yard bomb from Del Andrae, to wide-receiver Reynaldo shackelford.

On the Hornets next play from scrimmage fullback Ed Buens fumbled and P.S.U. linebacker Joe Carlisle recovered it at the Sacramento 44.

Following on the second down, Burnell Harris took a quick pitch off the right side, cut and ran into the end-zone. Thus giving the Viks a 14-0 lead with only three minutes six seconds elapsed in the game.

However, Sacramento refused to roll over and die. The Hornets moved the ball well and threaten to score mid-way through the first quarter Drew Wyant's pass for an apparently wide-open zeb-dee Brye was tipped away at last minute by safety Ken Feist.

In the second quarter the Hornets were down to the P.S.U. 29 yard line and sustaining a drive, when freshman safety Vince Barrett intercepted the ball for a 85 yard run back and touchdown.

Sac State's Derek Stigarts blocked the extra point, with 9:43 left in the half, and Viks led 20-0.

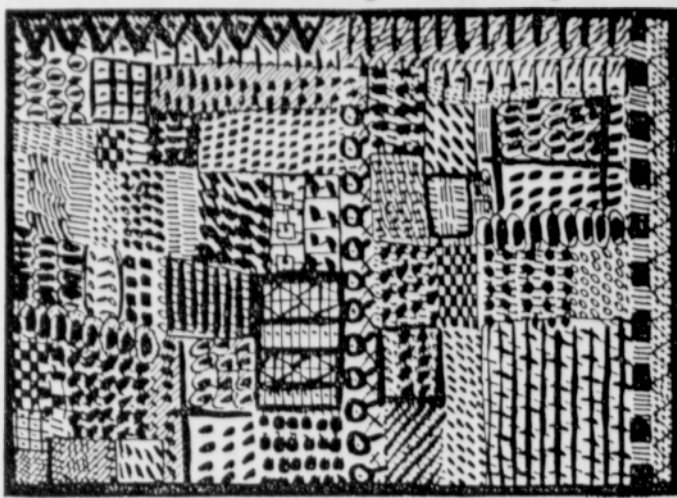
The Hornet's let another chance to score slip through their hands when Bueno fumbled the ball at the Vikings 10. But then P.S.U. overreached themselves trying to push the ball upfield in half's final minute, a scrambling Del Andrae slipped, lost his grip on the football and Keiley Matthews recovered.

With only enough time for one play on the clock, Wyant found Myhael Johnson open over the middle. Johnson made a juggling catch in the end-zone ending the half with P.S.U. leading 20-7.

During the third quarter with 10:24 remaining Barrett made his second scoring interception of the night. P.S.U. topped it with a two point conversion making the score 28-7 P.S.U.

The action picked after that, Wyant connected with Brye for a 62 yard touchdown to up the score to 28-13 after a missed conversion. The Viks grounded out a 72 yard drive that was capped with a Harvin 1 yard plunge putting the game out of reach at 35-13.

TEST DRIVE YOUR LICENSE.

The new Provisional Licensing Law affects teens under 18, whether you have your license or not. Here's what you need to know.

- Both teens who have licenses and who receive new provisional licenses will automatically lose their license for at least 90 days if a breath test shows a Blood Alcohol Content (BAC) of more than .00. **No alcohol is allowed.** If you refuse to take the breath test, you'll lose your license for at least a year.
- Beginning October 3, 1989, when you apply for a driver license, you'll take a safe-driving practices test in addition to the standard driving test. You'll also get a new kind of driver license. It's "provisional." It's a test. If you pass, it becomes a regular license when you're 18.
- For teens with a provisional license, the new law speeds up the penalty and driver improvement process. For example:
 - After just two minor violations, such as improper lane use, you'll have to meet with a driver improvement counselor to talk about ways to keep your license. After three minor violations, you'll lose your license until you complete a driver improvement program. After four minor violations, you'll lose your license until you are 18.
 - After just one major violation, such as drinking and driving, you'll lose your license until you are at least 18.

If you are a safe driver, you won't even notice the difference. But automobile crashes kill more teenagers than anything else. So, if you're not a safe driver, the new law just might keep you alive.

The new provisional license is a safe-driving test.
