WHEREAS:

The State of Oregon has a responsibility and a commitment to insure equality and the full participation of all its citizens so that they achieve the full benefits of citizenship; and

WHEREAS:

The State of Oregon recognizes the importance of the leadership provided by the great American, Dr. Martin Luther

King, Jr.; and

WHEREAS: With the passage of HB2705 by the Oregon Legislature in 1989, we are proud to join other states in setting aside a legal state holiday for grades K-12; and

WHEREAS:

The State of Oregon and its citizenry support the continued work to keep alive and to make real Dr. King's dream of

justice and equality.

NOW,

THEREFORE,

I, Neil Goldschmidt, Governor of the State of Oregon, hereby proclaim January 15, 1990, as

DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., DAY

in Oregon and encourage all citizens to join joyfully in this observance.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I hereunto set my hand and cause the Great Seal of the State of Oregon to be affixed. Done at the Capitol in The City of Salem and the State of Oregon, on this day, January 8, 1990.



Carter D. Womack, National President and the General Board of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc. confirmed the appointment of Dr. Lawrence E. Miller as national executive director during their national board retreat on Nov. 9-12, 1989 at the Miami Lakes Inn, Miami, Florida.


In his new position, Dr. Miller serve as the chief officer of operations for the fraternity's national headquarters, staff and its more that 90,000 membership. Dr. Miller will become the third national executive director of the fraternity since its founding in 1914 at Howard University in Washington, D.C.

"Lawrence's extraordinary record as a skilled manager speaks for itself," said President Womack following the announcement of Miller's hiring. "His knowledge of the fraternity and his sensitivity to the challenges we face in the 1990s make him that rare individual who combines the best elements of creativity and executive acumen," Womack added.

Dr. Miller will assume his new position in January of 1990. Prior to that, he served as housing assistant with the Department of Community Planning, Housing and Development in Arlington, Virginia.

"I accept this position with great anticipation. I am excited at the opportunity to work with seven regional directors and the membership of our organization," said Miller. "I believe that we will conquer the challenges that face the African-American males which will then strengthen our communities."

Born in Columbia, South Carolina and reared in Raleigh, North Carolina, Dr. Miller is a member of Alpha Sigma Chapter of the Fraternity. He also is currently serving as chairman of Alpha Sigma's reactivation
