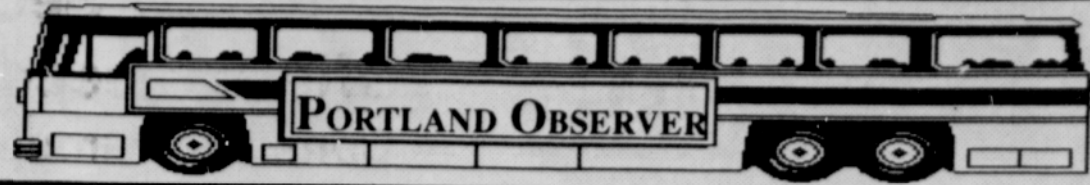

The Private Industry Council Hires Marketing Manager

Laurel Dukehart to Oversee Marketing Activities For All Programs

Laurel Dukehart was selected this week as Marketing Manager for the Private Industry Council. Ms. Dukehart will be responsible for marketing activities including public relations, promotion, customer service, market research, and market evaluation and planning. She will also coordinate the activities of the Marketing Committee of the Board of Directors and, with the president, serve as an official spokesperson for the organization.

SBA Awards Grant Minority Business Group

Portland Community College and the Oregon Association of Minority Entrepreneurs accepted a \$149,774 award from the U.S. Small Business Administration Jan. 24 to improve the success of minority-owned businesses throughout Oregon.

Representatives from PCC and OAME were on hand at Portland City Hall to receive the grant from SBA officials. Those present include OAME Executive Director Sam Brooks, PCC President Dan Moriarty, SBA Regional Administrator Harold Wolf and Erlene M. Patrick, SBA Minority Small Business and Capital Ownership Development Associate Administrator from Washington, D.C. Patrick oversees all of the agency's programs to assist the growth and development of minority-owned small businesses.

PCC's Small Business Development Center teamed with OAME to develop an innovative program that provides targeted management and technical assistance to disadvantaged businesses. The PCC/OAME program will provide one-on-one business counseling, workshops and seminars and business plan development to eligible firms, Brooks said.

Rose City Connection Offers Six Scholarships

Rose City Connection, Inc. offers six (\$500) scholarships to deserving African-American students who reside in the greater metropolitan area of the City of Portland. In addition, Rose City Connection will also award a full one (1) year scholarship which will cover tuition costs to Portland Community College. Scholarship funds must be used by applicants to pursue a college education or vocational training leading to a degree and/or proficiency in a profession or an applied science.

Rose City Connection, Inc. is a public service organization founded in 1983. Although its activities and goodwill cross many cultural and economic lines, Rose City Connection is predominately an African-American organization with strong roots in the community.

The minimum cumulative high school GPA of all applicants to be considered is 2.50. Students must also meet the following criterion:

1. Prospective high school graduate (June 1990) who has been accepted and/or will attend an accredited college, university, professional or vocation school.

2. Exhibit good moral character and not engage in any activity that will embarrass Rose City Connection and its members or compromise our ability to function as a fund raising organization.

In order to be considered for a Rose City Connection scholarship, applicants must submit: 1. A standardized Rose City Connection Scholarship Application form; 2. Full high school transcript with cumulative GPA score; 3. two (2) letters of reference; 4. An essay of not more than 2 typewritten pages responding to a topic of current interest to the Black Community. Incomplete applications or those not received by the deadline will not be considered.

Deadline for application submission is March 31, 1990. Send all materials to: Rose City Connection, Inc. Scholarship Fund, P.O. Box 5101, Portland, OR 97208.

Scholarship finalists will be chosen based upon an evaluation of responses to the essay question, completed application, transcript review and references. Selected applicants will then be invited to a personal interview.
