The Locker Room



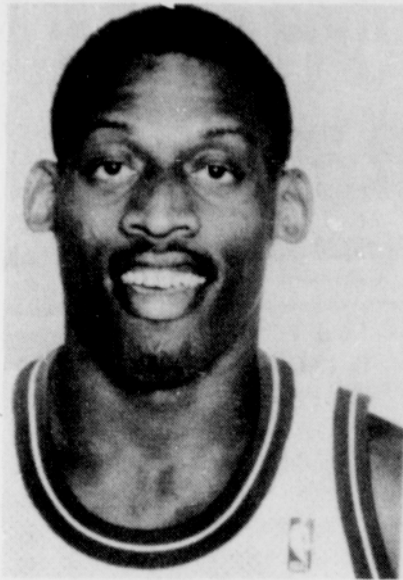

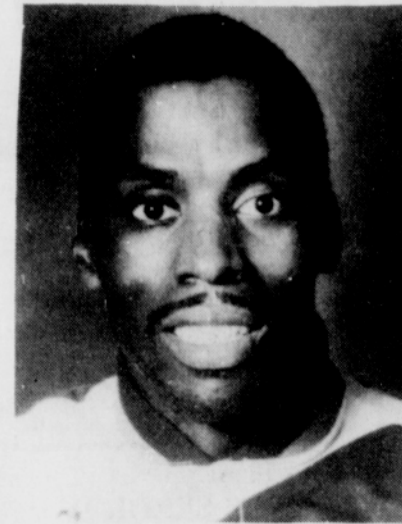

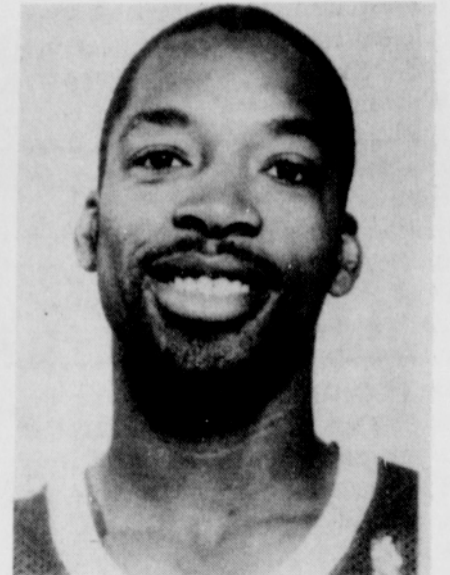

Eastman Parkway, Gresham, Oregon 97030, until Friday, April 13, 1990, at 10:00 A.M., Pacific Standard Time, at which time they will be opened, for the construction of the CHERRY PARK ROAD WATERLINE PROJECT #4113, POWELL VALLEY ROAD WATER DISTRICT INTERTIES PROJECT #4114, AND INTERMEDIATE-UPPER SERVICE LEVEL MODIFICATIONS PROJECT #4115.

The major quantities involved are as follows:

- 12" Ductile Iron pipe, in place 750 L.F.

Contractor for this work shall furnish all labor at current State of Oregon prevailing wage rates, materials and equipment and services of all kinds to complete the work in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor.
