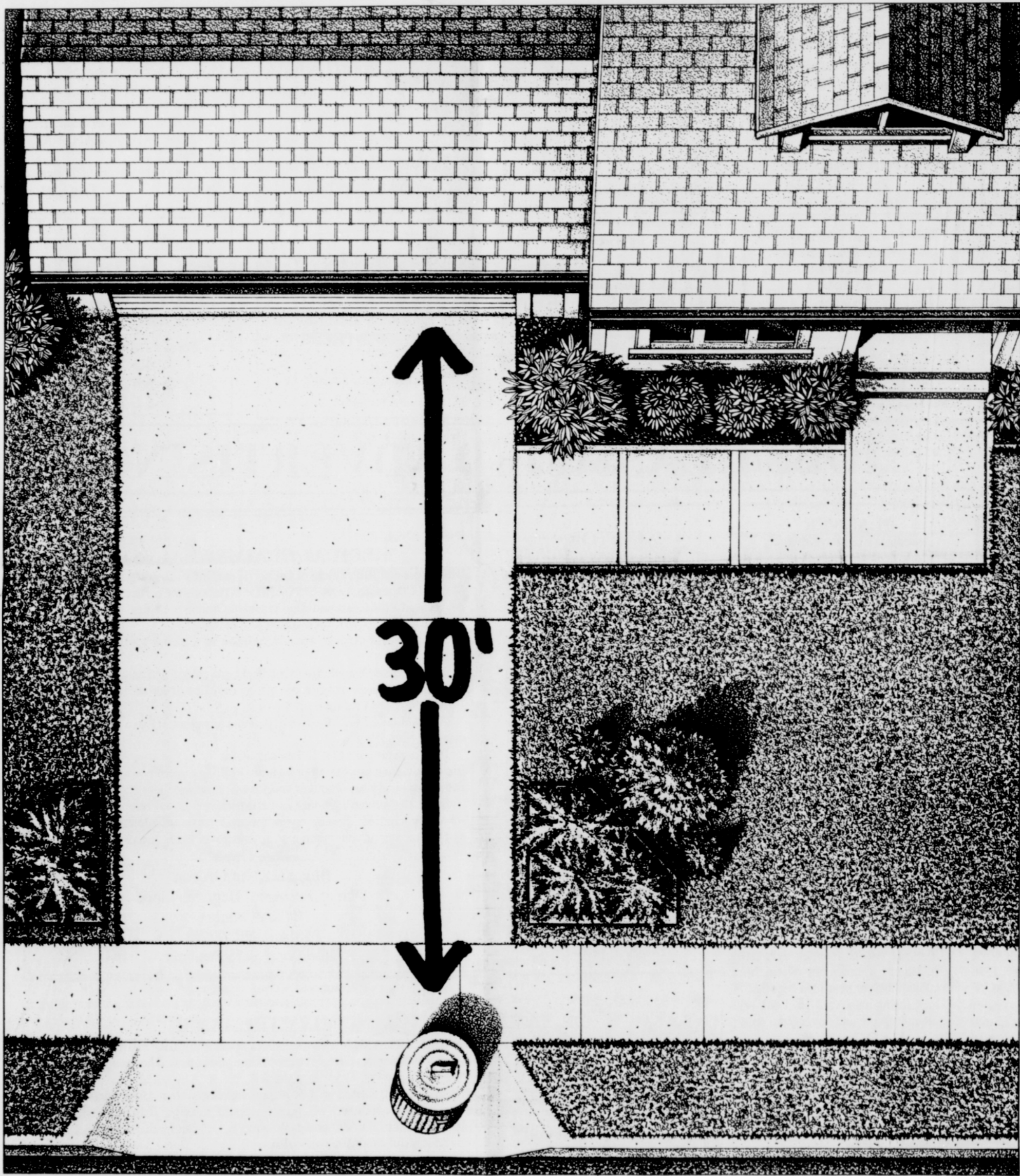


YOU'RE THIS CLOSE TO SOLVING OREGON'S GARBAGE CRISIS.



At least once a month in cities with over 4,000 residents, recyclables are picked up as part of regular garbage service. At no extra charge.

And we can say this with the utmost confidence. Because in Oregon, it's the law.

Recycling is easier than you think. Simply separate recyclables by type: glass, newspaper, tin or aluminum, cardboard and motor oil. Then leave them at curbside on your designated recycling day. (Ask your hauler for specifics.)

A few grocery bags, cardboard boxes or old crates make a convenient recycling center that fits neatly into a corner of your garage, kitchen, basement or porch. In some areas, haulers will even provide free reusable containers.

So start doing your part: Recycle. We have a long way to go to solve Oregon's solid waste problem. But the length of your driveway is a good place to start.
