



Minority Health Conference May 3-4

Setting Oregon's Minority Health Agenda For The 1990s is the theme of the first annual statewide minority health conference to be held on May 3-4, 1990, at the Red Lion Lloyd Center in Portland. The conference will bring people from all over the state together to share information about the health of racial and ethnic minorities in Oregon. and provide an opportunity for networking and coalition building.

Keynote presenters include:

Reed V. Tuckson, M.D., Senior Vice-President of Programs, National March of Dimes, White Plains, N.Y. Dr. Tuckson was formerly the Health Commissioner of the Washington, D.C. Health Department, and previously was Administrator of the Mental Retardation and Development Disabilities Administration in Washington. He will discuss the problem of infant mortality in minority populations.

Deborah Prothrow-Stith, M.D., Vice-President and Medical Director of Community Care Systems, Inc., Boston, M.A. Dr. Prothrow-Stith was formerly the Commissioner of the Massachusetts Department of Health. She also served as an Assistant Professor of Medicine at the Boston University School of Medicine. She will discuss adolescent violence as a public health issue, and its consequences on minority health.

William Robinson, M.D., Executive Director, Office of Minority Health, U.S. Public Health Service, Washington, D.C. Dr. Robinson will discuss the status of minority health at the national level.

Over 80 presenters will be available throughout the conference, offering workshops on Hispanic, Asian, Indian, African and refugee health issues.

The conference is open to public and private health care providers, community-based organizations and groups, legislators and key decision makers, and anyone interested in minority health issues.
