

According to the statistics compiled by the Portland School District for 1989 high school graduates, of the 2,744 who graduated, approximately 1,800 indicated they were going to college. Simply speaking, this means almost 1,000 Portland area youth sought training and/or employment careers in a somewhat promising market in the northwest.

This year's graduates are expected to increase by approximately 8%-10%, and according to forecasts, will bring with them some of the skills and training mandated by employers.
