His body was found Wednesday, August 15, 1990 in his San Diego, California apartment. He had chronic emphysema. A friend had attempted to reach him by phone, and knew he was home, so he went to his apartment and found him on the floor of his bathroom. He died from the lack of oxygen. He had an oxygen tank in the apartment but was unable to reach it in

The United Methodists have appointed a bishop full time on a one tivities, there is growing evidence that year special "drug-busting" assignment.




The Church battle against drugs covers a broad range of functions--




