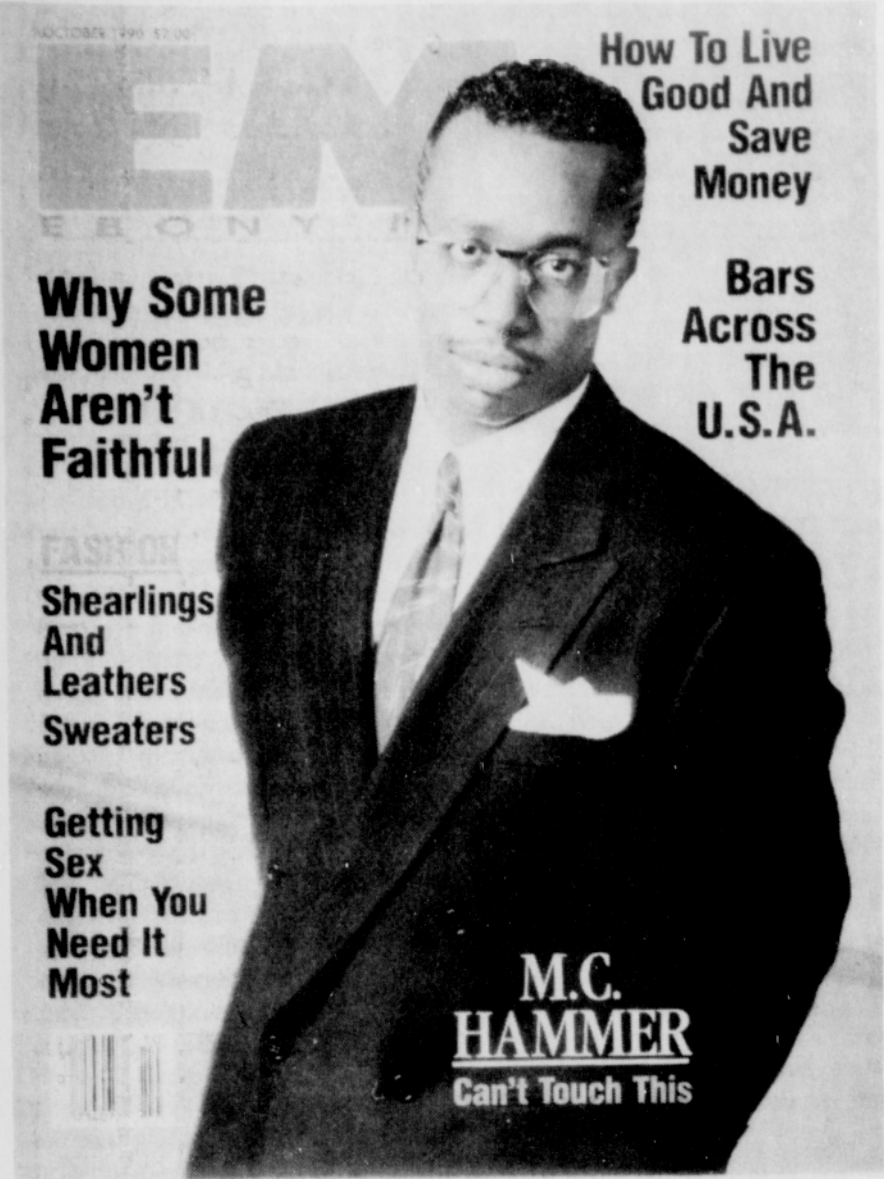

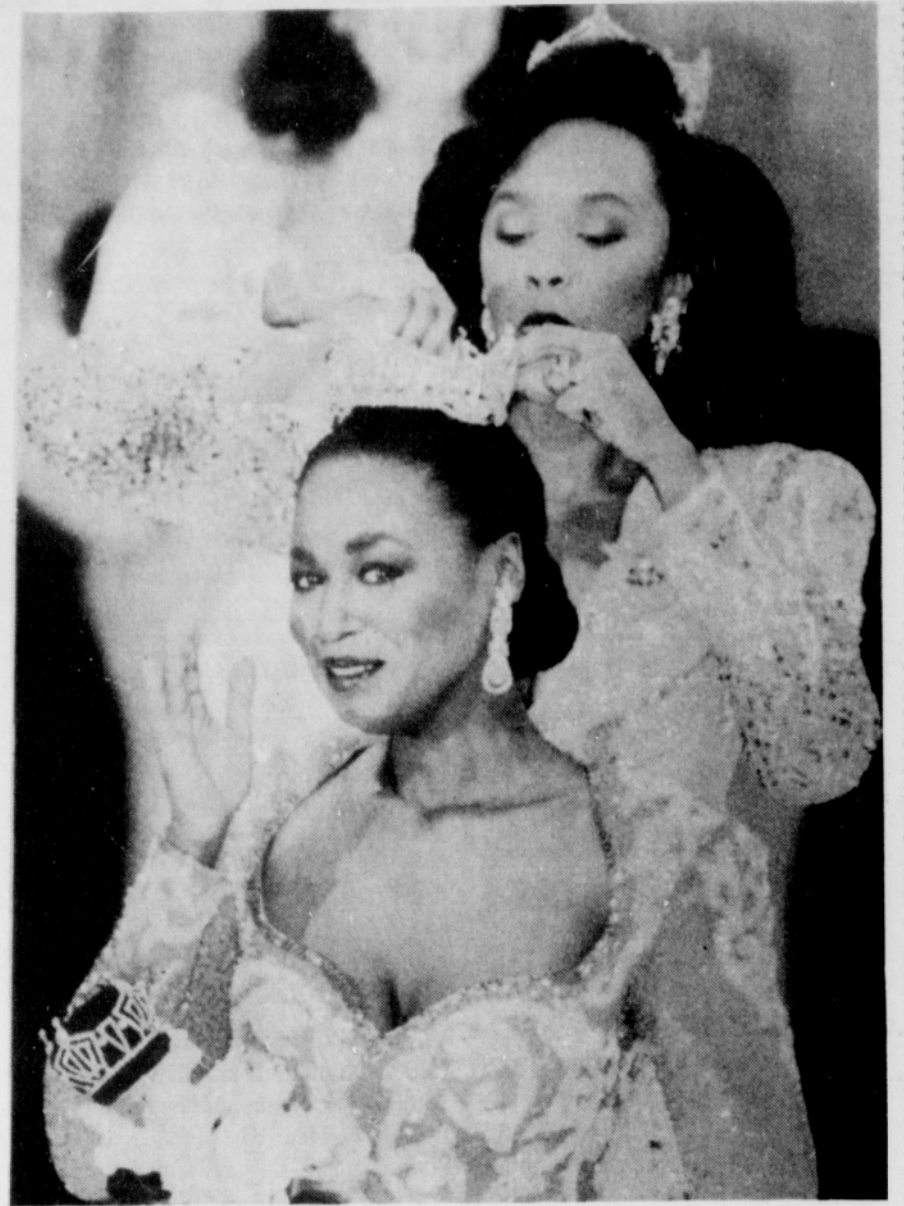
Hammer, 27, the high-energy superstar whose talent as a rapper, dancer and actor has extended to music, dance, videos and commercial endorsements, today

Still celebrating the unprecedented success of his hit LP, "Please Hammer, Don't Hurt 'Em," currently the biggest-selling rap album of all time, Hammer tells why he's much more than just a one-dimensional rapper. "I'm an entertainer," Hammer says. "Rap, in the way I'm presenting it has no limitations. My music has as much singing and dancing as any pop record," he adds.
