ELDER CURNEL WALDEN was born to the late Robert Walden and Mrs. Jossie Walden, March 25, 1938, in the state of Mississippi. He dedicated his life to Christ in a Sunday morning service at Faith Tabernacle Church, in a store front building on Williams Avenue, February 17, 1963, where he was blessed and couldn't let go until God came into his life and filled him with the Holy Ghost. He went to fulfill a request, salvation was just a prayer away. Since that day he has been faithful in God's work and dedicated to his call.

CURNEL WALDEN came to Portland June of 1944. His employment history has been varied, such as: University of Oregon Health Science Center, Nate Hartley Fuel Oil, Vancouver Foundry, Columbia Steel Mill and his current place of employment is James Rivers Paper Mill in Camas, Washington.

On Sunday, October 14, 1990, an installation ceremony was held at 4 p.m. in honor of Elder Curnel Walden. The

joyous ceremony was both spiritual and cherishable.

His wife of thirty years, the former Willie Kennedy, sat at his side as he received his installation charge. Following the morning service, the church held a pot luck in honor of Elder Walden's new assignment. As everyone sat eating, enjoying the morsels prepared by the families of the church, Elder Walden was scurrying about busily preparing for the baptism of a new member. As he hurried, his white garment, that he was wearing resembled angles' wings stretched wide and soaring.

Curnel will now serve as the assistant pastor to Bishop Grace C. Osborne.

As a member of Faith Tabernacle for 27 years, Curnel has served in many departments of the church, such as: usher board, choir, deacon, trustee, youth department, youth leader, Sunday school teacher, chairman of the deacon board, janitor, church transportation, coordinator and appointed pastor in charge.

Elder Walden was ordained by Bishop Louis W. Osborne in 1972, which was a

day that he shall always remember and hold dear and near to his heart.

Curnel and Willie Walden are the proud parents of not one but four sons: Gary, Cory, Bryan and Byron.

Elder Walden received a certificate of appreciation for serving the longest, continuous membership in Faith Tabernacle's history and he has received several certificates of honor in other areas.

He attended Aeon Bible extension, A.L. Hardy Academy of Theology, receiving a Bachelor of Theology (B.Th.).

God has truly blessed Elder Walden. For in his christian walk, he has been an unselfish servant of God. He has touched the lives of so many. As a side job, he repairs furnaces for many who would otherwise not be able to have their furnaces operating. Why? He does many for gratis. Just because. Or-he will say, "Pay me whatever you can afford."

Magnolia E. Speed Taylor was born on October 22, 1913, in Minden Louisiana. Magnolia entered grammar school in 1925, finished High School in 1929 at age 15. Magnolia completed her college education June 1937 at Texas College, receiving her B.A. in education.

On February 13, 1934, she and Booker Taylor were united in marriage. In 1941 they moved from DeKalb, Texas to Portland, Oregon, where they joined Bethel A.M.E. church. She joined the Senior choir, where she served as Organist and choral director for 40 years.

In 1945 she taught at Blessed Martin Day Nursery for 24 years. In 1968-69, she worked as Group Worker at the Donald E. Long Juvenile Home. At the same time she entered the Head Start Program Early Childhood Education. In 1969 with a Fellowship Grant she earned her Master's degree in Behavioral Modification. In 1970 she taught at Irvington Elementary School for nine years. In 1979 she retired from the Portland Public School Dist.

She was a member of NEA, OEA, Oregon Retired Teachers, Alumni of Oregon University, a volunteer with Red Cross Blood Pressure Clinics, and League of Women Voters.

The Lord took Magnolia home on September 11, 1990. She leaves to celebrate her life a loving son, Booker T. Taylor Jr., and her daughter, Dolores A. Taylor-Newborne. A grandmother and a great-grandmother. She left a host of friends.
