Haemophilus b is the most common cause of bacterial meningitis in the United States, and also causes pneumonia, and sepsis or blood poisoning. Haemophilus infections can be fatal and may cause permanent neurologic damage in children who survive. Each year, an estimated 12,000 children fall ill from Haemophilus in the United States, including an average of 120 children per year in Oregon. One in 200 children become sick with haemophilus infections sometime during the first five years of life, most often during the first year.

The vast majority of these infections can be prevented by the new vaccine. The vaccine, called Haemophilus b conjugate vaccine, is given to infants at two, four, and six months of age, with a booster at 15 months of age. Previously, Haemophilus vaccine had been given to children at 15 months of age, too late to prevent most illness. The newly licensed vaccine (Lederle-Praxis' HibTITER) is

All children in Oregon should be immunized with Haemophilus b conjugate vaccine beginning at 2 months of age, the age when routine childhood immunizations are started. Immunization may be given at the same time as diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis (DTP) and polio immunization.

The number and timing of doses for these older children depends on their age. Parents with children between 2 and 15 months of age should contact the provider of their child's immunization to arrange an appointment schedule. Immunization is also recommended for children age 15 months to 5 years who have not previously received Haemophilus b vaccine.

Haemophilus b immunization is available at private clinics and physician offices as well as local health departments in Oregon. Please call ahead for scheduling. Vaccine is provided free of charge at local health departments. A modest administration fee may be requested but no one will be denied vaccine because of an inability to pay.

The vaccine was licensed to use for infants on October 4, 1990 by the U.S. Food and Drug administration.
