Not only can I handle it, but what my prophetic writing partner has forgotten, like so many other people, is that lovemaking is not about sexual intercourse. For the "act" is just a small part of the entire relationship and should be treated as such. It's not about what she wants or

when he needs it, or even where it should be done! Lovemaking is about how you and your mate operate on a day to day basis. And it is that tinteraction that not only has a direct affect on the other areas of your relationship, but it will also reflect in the quality of sexual intimacy.

Lovemaking has a far deeper meaning than that of sex because it requires more attentiveness from those involved. It also demands a greater sense of responsibility from both parties and it takes more effort to sustain those bonds already formed. It is a sacrifice so great that it makes the reward much more significant, so much so that it cannot be measured through temporary satisfaction.

For example, I have girlfriends who say that their relationships with their boyfriends could be better if they communicated more effectively and more often. 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> ship. Peculiarly, people in this situationand there are many--think that thev have a great relationship. How can . hey? How can anyone think that they have a solid, loving relationship if the only time they really talk to each other is when the act is the subject that allows openness? Sexual intercourse will take place, but one of the partners is not going to be satisfied, because this is the only area that has been developed.

What is the purpose, then, of even discussing what one needs and wants of a sexual relationship when some cannot discuss past hurts, dreams, or pet peeves? Lovemaking means sharing your thoughts, even the most mundane, with each other. It naturally brings you closer and allows the leeway to speak more often and openup more variety in discussions. This in turn will lead to an honest attempt at disussing sexual needs.

And what about romance? This too is a part of lovemaking, yet some don't have the chance to experience it, especially young people who think lovemaking is, once again, about sex. Some have even become so complacent in their relationships that they have forgotten how to romance their partner. Now

It means listening to a mate who has had a bad day at work and offering nothing but your shoulder to cry on. What about supporting

your mate during a crisis? Lovemaking means being there when the chips are down and no one else understands or cares for that much, what you are feeling or what you are going through. It means helping them get through the bad times and gingerly encouraging to go on with life at their own pace.

All of these things embody what lovemaking is. If you don't have an open line of communication, if you don't have romance, and if you don't have support, athen you can just forget about sexual intimacy.
