More Black Children in Poverty, Study Finds

Nearly half of the nation's black children live below the poverty line, and vast numbers of those children, particularly in the Northeast and the Midwest, are sinking deeper into poverty. These are among the conclusions of a research study recently completed by the Joint Center for Political and Economic Studies.
