Independent television producer Sheila Brooks won top honors in the 1990 CEBA Awards of Excellence for Best Television Documentary in the Country during the recent 13th annual CEBA Awards presentation at the New York Hilton Hotel. Ms. Brooks' one hour documentary, "The Color of Death," examined the problems of drug-related violent crime in the nation's capitol, Washington, DC. The documentary was shown on the FOX Broadcasting affiliate, WTTG-TV, Channel 5, in Washington. Presented by the World Institute of Black Communications, Inc., the Communications Excellence to Black Audiences (CEBA) Awards are presented to "corporations, advertising agencies and individuals who recognize the value of human dignity, cultural diversity and ethnic pride in marketing to African American consumers."

More Black Children in Poverty, Study Finds

Nearly half of the nation's black children live below the poverty line, and vast numbers of those children, particularly in the Northeast and the Midwest, are sinking deeper into poverty. These are among the conclusions of a research study recently completed by the Joint Center for Political and Economic Studies. A summary of the findings will be reported at a half-day conference convened by the Joint Center to discuss the worsening economic status of black children and explore potential policy solutions.
