For the first time in our nation's history, our dependable troops were armed in preparation to fight in someone else's cultural ball game with strict adherence to that land we had come to protect!

Our own desires and preferences were secondary, we were told, to the strict Moslem law of the land...women (including those who had come to perform in the de riguer sex-sirenish "Madonna" garb of the scanty-sequinned maidens to make our boys forget the dreary, dusty, dreadfulness of Desert Shield...were forbidden to be seen in such frivolous lack of attire. Our legendary entertainer of troops, Bob Hope was authoritatively told to leave the women or have them suitably dressed in cover, head-to-toe which would pass muster with the Saudis but leave our own boys feeling, as if they were being entertained by a Golden Girls' chorusline of monks.

Christmas in Saudi Arabia was a real hoot. No liquor...no beer...no Auld-Lang-Syne hot toddies more potent than powdered milk, which mixed with the dust, could be brought to as pasty brew that might be mixed with water...if you could find any desert-side beyond a mirage of an oasis. Bottled water was one's best bet, and speckled with desert dust instead of bubbles, one could at least think of it as champagne...a bit of madness in the middle of the madness! However, temperance and moderation should prevail, I believe. While there is

an Iraqi underground, helping our troops with videotapes and reports that are both radiotelegraphed or brought into Saudi Arabia by special courier, we realize that our decision to abide by all of Saudi Arabia customs, is not contingent upon this brave group of anti-Hussein rebels. We are instructing all of our troops to conform to the ways and circumscribed dress of the very nation we have come to help...indeed the price of oil and how to save it for the Saudis is our prime focus for being there, it is not?

I cannot goose-pimple with delight when President Bush announces his virtuous stance to prevent a dictator like Saddam Hussein from abusing human rights. \*1983-German medical supplier Karl Kolb Gmbh constructs six "pesticide plants" for Saddam. Saddam

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

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

Consider the scenario as you are directed (encouraged) to interface with any or all of a host of governmental institutions, all with the advertised goal of bringing minorities and women into the economic mainstream of America. Where to embark? Small Business Administration-Business Incubator-Minority Set Asides-Lease Guarantees-Specific programs of various Public Agencies or Large Corporations?

There are, of course, many advisors and consultants around, some independent, but most employed or contracted by the agencies named above. You must understand, however, that few if any of these persons have had 'real-time' successful busi-They frequently exchanged visits at ness experience-meeting payrolls, their respective homes. When they marketing a product, or making a profit (if so, they would still be in white father, a wealthy lumberman, business!). Most have simply met the

service exam written by a 'non-business person-or have demonstrated an ability to 'successfully relate' in some social community service area. A year or two of college business courses is quite acceptable, as is knowing someone already on board.

These points should prompt Now, when we posed the question, a consideration that 'you' may be in mind rather than the system, when the judgment is pronounced, "Designed To Fail." The more preliminary research and investigation performed, the better and more detailed information and advice you will receive when first entering the system. Usually your initial contact will quickly refer you to some one more knowledgeable when realizing that he is inadequate to the occasion. This is not always the case and often one loses a great deal of valuable time in such a situation. It is best to allow a good measure of 'lead time' in all phases of your project.

You may think it of little consequence that you have neither the required capital or experience prerequisite to success in the particular business enterprise. "After all they know I'm a minority, and if I had all that 'good stuff' I wouldn't need them anyway." You would be surprised at how many enter the system with this attitude; I encountered dozens of them in the business classes I taught.
