Actor From Do The Right Thing To Speak On Racism At Willamette University



LeVar Burton has been seen "rolling" around several U.S. cities.

In a major effort to help kids want to read for pleasure, Burton, nine-year host of Reading Rainbow, has joined forces with Bozell Advertising, Mpls., TDI (Transportation Displays Incorporated), the National Science Foundaton and Reading Rainbow's first ever outof-home public service advertising campaign.

The campaign's goal is to make influential adults of at-risk kids aware of Reading Rainbow-a public television program that encourages 5 to 8 yearolds to read for pleasure. We want parents and adults to encourage children to watch the show and in turn get excited about reading.

To reach this goal, Burton will drive the message "A TV Program That Turns Kids On To Reading: Reading Rainbow" home on exterior bus posters and billboards located in three major U.S. cities, Mpls./St. Paul, New York and Los Angeles. More importantly, the message will appear in both English and Spanish in New York and Los Angeles. Following the success of the campaign in these test markets, the creative design will be provided to PBS stations acrtoss the country enabling them to plan their own localized outof-home campaigns.
