Community Talent Back NPBC Effort

On Saturday, March 2, 1991, at 7:00 p.m., at Maranatha Church, North Portland Bible College (NPBC) will hold its 1st Annual Gospel Music Celebration to benefit its building and campus fund. The Inspirational Sounds, a community choir hailing from Eugene and led by Brother John Gainer, will headline the event, with selections from their finest offerings. Soloists will include Sister Mattie Ann Callier-Spears, and Brother Dan Johnson, a highway patrolman. The Mt. Olivet Men's Chorus will belt out old-time gospel sounds, under the leadership of Brother Roland Harris, an accomplished vocalist in his own right. A very fine example of young Christian women from Maranatha Church, entitled "His Song," will wow us with their dedicating to the Lord an music. A Fellowship mass choir, consisting of members from Mt. Sinai, Mr. Gillard, Macedonia, Antioch Missionary and Union Avenue Baptist Churches will provide the finale.

The administration, instructors, students, and board members, alike, of NPBC are extremely enthusiastic about the prospect of the Bible College having "a place of our own." Housed in Maranatha's basement from its inception in 1982 until the fall of 1990, when it moved to Berean Baptist's basement, the Bible College has been blessed by the hospitality of both bodies. However, as NPBC proceeds further into equipping and in the community, it has

become increasingly clear that there are urgent opportunities for ministries within the community that the Bible College could explore, given its own facility. Thus far, over 300 students from over 30 churches have benefited from courses offered at NPBC. The Bible College looks forward to making itself available to an even wider segment of the population with the convenience and space a campus of its own would afford. Support from the greater community is needed in the effort to acquire a permanent campus. NPBC does not have a high profit margin, because it charges only \$10 for registration and \$25 for each class in order to make Bible-based learning more affordable to its constituency. The closest Bible College in terms of convenience to the community is located on NE 84th and Glisan. It is a very fine school, but most individuals in our community cannot afford its fees. Another important fact about NPBC is that it offers classes, for the most part, during evening hours so that working students might participate.

NPBC asks that you come on out and support them and our community talent with your participation in the Gospel Music Celebration. Tickets are available for a \$6.50 advance donation, with children under 10 admitted free. 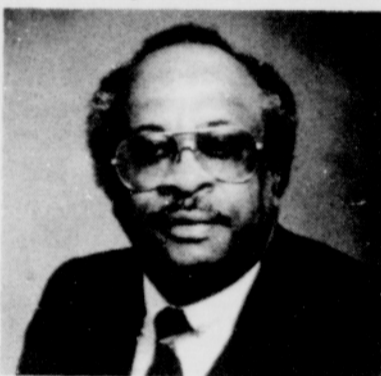

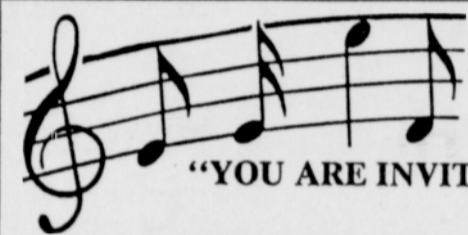

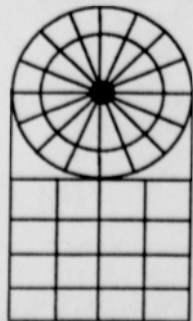
