Artists Repertory Theatre Extends Run of "The Subject Was Roses"

Artists Repertory Theatre announces the extension of the popular play "The Subject Was Roses" through April 13. "The Subject Was Roses", a glowing eloquent play trailing bouquets of prizes and the credentials of a two-year run on Broadway, opened March 1 at A.R.T. The production has built an audience over the last three weeks to justify adding performances for an additional week, extending the run to mid-April. The extension will include a Sunday matinee performance on April 7.

The Pulitzer prize-winning play by Frank D. Gilroy features A.R.T. veterans Vana O'Brien and Ted Roisum and A.R.T. newcomer Kelly AuCoin in the story of a chain reaction that occurs from a gift of flowers. The play also won the Drama Critics Award for Best Play in 1965 and the Tony Award for Best Play the same year.

A compassionate drama filled with the humor and pain of ordinary family relationships, "The Subject Was Roses" displays the trials of a family in which a husband and wife nurse old wounds, and both try to make their son an ally against the other. Resentments erupt when the son returns from three years in

the Army and, having had the opportunity to get some distance, realizes that the primary family dynamics are ones he feels need changing. The subject is really about the adjustments to one another that a family must make when it has waited too long to communicate.

The Subject Was Roses is the first play this season to be directed by Allen Nause, A.R.T.'s Artistic Director. The drama reunites a dynamic ensemble of theatre artists from the 1990 awardwinning production of Long Day's Journey into Night. For that play, Nause won a Drammy Award for Best Director and O'Brien won for Best Actress. A Drammy also went to Long Day's Journey into Night for Distinguished Production, and the Ensemble Acting Award went to Ted Roisum and Vana O'Brien, among others.

Allen Nause (Director) provides the artistic leadership at Artists Repertory Theatre. Nause, an actor with more than 25 years of professional experience, first became enamored with this play 23 years ago when he recreated the role of Timmy at the San Mateo (California, Hillbarn Theatre.

Jon Lucien, international performing and recording artist, musician, composer and arranger, re-enters the music scene with a brilliant new album "LISTEN LOVE": his debut release on Mercury Records.

Smooth and easy, with a pleasing aftertaste that gently caresses the tastebuds, Jon's new album frames the magnificence of this rare performer. His warm rhythmical lyrics and melodies reflect the essence of his native St. Thomas, where, as a young boy, he learned the musical skills of his father, Eric, an accomplished classical guitarist, and his mother, Eloise, a singer.

His distinctive voice has been featured in over a dozen television and radio commercial endorsements including: Air Jamaica, Almond Joy, Burger King, Diet Seven Up, Exxon and U.S. Virgin Islands.

Now after a self-imposed hiatus lasting almost a decade, Jon Lucien, the man whose seductive tenor-baritone vocals put the quiet in the storm, is back with "LISTEN LOVE" which he produced and wrote. Jon also utilized the remarkable talents of Jeff Lorber to produce two of the cuts.

With such rhythmically sensual romantic songs like: "Sweet Control", "Nothing Lasts Forever", Listen Love", and "You Take My Breath Away", there's no doubt that this new album will place Jon Lucien back in the forefront of the music scene. "I can't let the fear of musical barriers hinder me", he adds, summing it all up. "Because in the final analysis it's humans that are listening and they're going to make their own choices.".
