





Among the services at the screenings are blood chemistry tests which include cholesterol, glucose and amelia measurements, blood pressure, colorectal cancer take-home test kit, lung function and hearing testing. Vision and glaucoma assessments, nutritional counseling and foot care evaluation are also usually offered. Appointments are necessary and may be made by calling the screening site.






