the number of survivors.") Our point is that in order to reform the "justice" system, one must be able to see the "stage" clearly -- and this is difficult when the dancers obscure the dance. Occasionally, the plot is clearly seen as when, two weeks ago, a nonnetwork channel, 12, aired a documentary on crime with a different perspective. The nation's physicians, law enforcement people, school administrators and sociologists stated the greatest number of crimes and the greatest use of drugs is by WHITE YOUTH -- and occurs in suburbia and in rural areas. Then, previously misled here by that "medium-isthe-message" media circus, it could well be that we have been equally "snowed" in respect to the origin, purpose and real socioeconomic significance of the "ghetto." Let us see if that is not true; first a modern day scenario.

I have selected Los Angeles for an exposition because not only can I speak

from first hand experience (1954 - 1964), but because early on this urban maelstrom exhibited at one time all of the hopes, dreams, shocks and pathologies of an "upwardly mobile" race of people ("Free at last, Free at last, Free at last"). That is, a full THIRTY YEARS AGO this city was a model or metaphor for any of the urban behaviors and traumas we think new. I have furnished some insights gained from personal experience -- and further would have you note that AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL is just now getting around to investigating a spate of fatal shootings and the videotaped beating of Rodney King. They are 30 years late in this town where street gangs were invented.

To give my account a degree of substance and validity let me point out that during most of this period I was a public accountant with an "interracial" practice that ranged the length and breadth of the city -- retailers, contractors, small manufacturers, laundries, machine shops, and the like. Interestingly, I will use two innercity "retail" establishments as a point of departure; "Ish's Sportsman's Cafe" and the "Western Avenue Drive-In." The first location was a popular cocktail bar where that "upwardly mobile" black middle class hung out. The lawyers, the doctors, engineers, teachers, civil service, ballplayers -- and my cocktail buddy, "Tom Bradley," Precinct Captain at the 77th (later to be Mayor of Los Angeles).

The second location was a restaurant account of mine that turned out to be the world's largest drive-in drug retailer. Next week, the meaning of it all -if any.
