## Corporate America To Honor NAACP's Dr. Benjamin Hooks Roger Enrico of Frito-Lay to Serve as Dinner chairman.

Corporate America will gather December 11, 1991 at the New York Hilton and Towers to honor Dr. Benjamin Hooks, executive director of the national Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), for a lifetime of service to the civil rights movement. Corporate chairman for the event is Roger Enrico, chairman and CEO of Frito-Lay, Inc., a division of PepsiCo., Inc.

Dr. Hooks is beginning his 15th year as executive director for NAACP. Founded in 1909, NAACP is the largest and oldest civil rights orgainization in the world, with some 2,200 local branches and a nationwide membership of more than 500,000 individuals.

Under the leadership of Dr. Hooks, NAACP has had an active and broad role in minority affiars. NAACP programs assist poor and minority people in the fields of education, employment, voter registration and information, youth programs and prison reforms. The organization also monitors and proposes legislation that affects civil and human rights.

Dr. Hooks was appointed executive director in 1977. In 1979 he led the Prayer Vigil in Washington, D.C., which was successful in helping defeat an anti-busing amendment. In 1980 he became the first civil rights leader to address both the Democratic and Republican national conventions in the same year.

Benefit Chairman Roger Enrico became chairman and CEO of Frito-Lay in 1990. Prior to this he was president and CEO of PepsiCo Worldwide Beverages, which includes Pepsi-Cola and international soft drink operations. During his tenure, Pepsi-Cola sales reached \$6.5 billion and profits hit more than \$750 million. Mr. Enrico is the author of "The Other Guy Blinked," the story of how Pepsi won the cola wars. PepsiCo, Inc. is an \$18 billion corporation with a leadership position in soft drinks, snack foods and restau-
