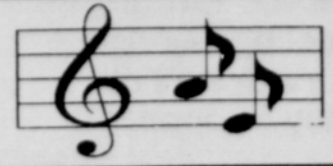

Cosby And AT&T Celebrate Crossroads Theatre Company Opening



Bill Cosby donated his time and talent to help Crossroads Theatre company celebrate the opening of their new building, recognizing the company's past accomplishments and encouraging its future efforts in support of Black theater artists.

"AT&T Presents Bill Cosby Live! A Salute to Crossroads Theatre company" formally opened Crossroads' new building Oct. 25-27 in New Brunswick's downtown district, at the heart of the city's cultural center.

Ricardo Khan (pictured, second from left) Crossroads' co-founder, producer and artistic director, said Cosby's "generosity toward Crossroads is an affirmation of the important role that professional African American Theater plays in nurturing and supporting the work of black artists and also as a keeper of the culture."

AT&T Chairman Robert E. Allen and his wife Betty (pictured at right) also attended the event. AT&T sponsored the gala events surrounding Cosby's five performances and the opening of the new \$3 million facility.

Over the past 10 years, AT&T has

contributed a quarter-million dollars to Crossroads, emphasizing the company's commitment to the creation of new artistic works and to bringing the work of women and minority artists to a wider public.

"AT&T is proud to continue its 10-year relationship with Crossroads as a sponsor of this historic event," said Allen.

"Crossroads has helped create an awareness, not only in New Jersey, but nationally, of the contributions by Black playwrights, actors and directors to the theatre arts."

Founded in 1978, Crossroads formerly occupied a century-old onetime garment factory on the edge of the city's downtown area, where it has created and produced works that have gone on to national and international acclaim such as "Black Eagles," the story of the Tuskegee Airmen. The 1991-92 theater season for this Actor's Equity regional theater begins with a production of "Black Orpheus," inspired by the 1958 film focusing on the classic love story of Orpheus and Eurydice set in present-day Trinidad during Carnival.
