#### Mike Shimensky Blazer MVP In December

Mike Shimensky has to be the players choice for MVP this month. If you aren't an avid Portland Trail Blazer fan you are probably saying: Who is Mike Shimensky?

Mike Shimensky is the trainer for the Portland Trail Blazers. Shimensky is probably one of the busiest men in the NBA right now. Mike may not be the Most Valuable Player on the Trail Blazers but this December a lot of the basketball stars would award him the Most Valuable Person Award. December has been an unusually "physical" month for the home town team. Several players on the team have been banged up in one form or another. Blazer fans have not heard much from Ennis Whatley who is on the mend with a fractured ankle. Nor have they had the opportunity to watch Lamont Strothers who has been hampered with back spasms. Both men have been on the disabled list since Oct. 31.

Kevin Duckworth, had to leave the Timberwolves in the third quarter with a sprained ankle. Since Kevin Duck-

worth is not bothered by the painful groin pull that Shimensky was treating. Portland fans are starting to see the "old Duck" they remember. In the Monday night game against the Minnesota Timberwolves, he had led the team in scoring and rebounds after the first quarter, and it looked like another 20 point night was in store. Then it happened. Duckworth had to leave the game with a sprained ankle. You could see the pain registered on Duckworth's face from the top row of the coliseum. Duck was done for the night. "Magic Mike" went to work in the locker room. By the end of the game the treatment was halted and Kevin Duckworth left the coliseum under his own power with just a hint of tenderness in his right

The list of injured players on the Trail Blazers is only marginally shorter than the "healthy list." Terry Porter has a mild sprain on his left ankle. Jerome Kersey has been dealing with a sprained right ankle for weeks. Danny Ainge is still troubled by a right knee strain and don't forget the Blazers still

have two fine ballplayers on the injured reserved list yet to be heard from. Ennis Whatley and Lamont Strothers were both placed on Injured reserved back on Oct. 31. Whatley had a fractured right ankle and Strothers was sidelined with back spasms. "The players are all great about the treatments. They show up on time for our therapy sessions and follow the treatment regimens. Their pros. They want to play.

He doesn't like to take credit for keeping the Blazers physically able to play. Mike will tell you, "the players are such fine young athletes and in such excellent physical shape the healing process is greatly accelerated. Conditioning is an important part of the Blazers Training program," he continued. "At the Trail Blazers, if a player does not play at least 20 minutes during the game, they have to do a conditioning workout after the game, before they go home. They usually have their choice of the Stairmaster, treadmill or the stationary bicycle."

Mike had some advice to kids who play sports when they get injured. "Ice down an injury as soon as possible. You can repeat the icing process several times, but only about 20 minutes at a time. "You get that advice from one of the best in the business.

In the sports world, a lot of praise is slashed around to an awful a lot of people. It's part of the game. Mike Shimensky lets compliments about his work roll off his back like the proverbial water on a ducks back. Shimensky is in a poistion we would all like to be in. He likes his job he is good at it and he likes the people he works with. They respect his ability. That's about as much as the average man can expect out of life. That's more than most of us get. He seems to prefer to stay out of the lime light. Next time you are at a Portland Trail Blazers game give Mike a "Thumbs up." He'll probably be to busy working on someone to talk...but he'll know, that you know he is an MVP.
