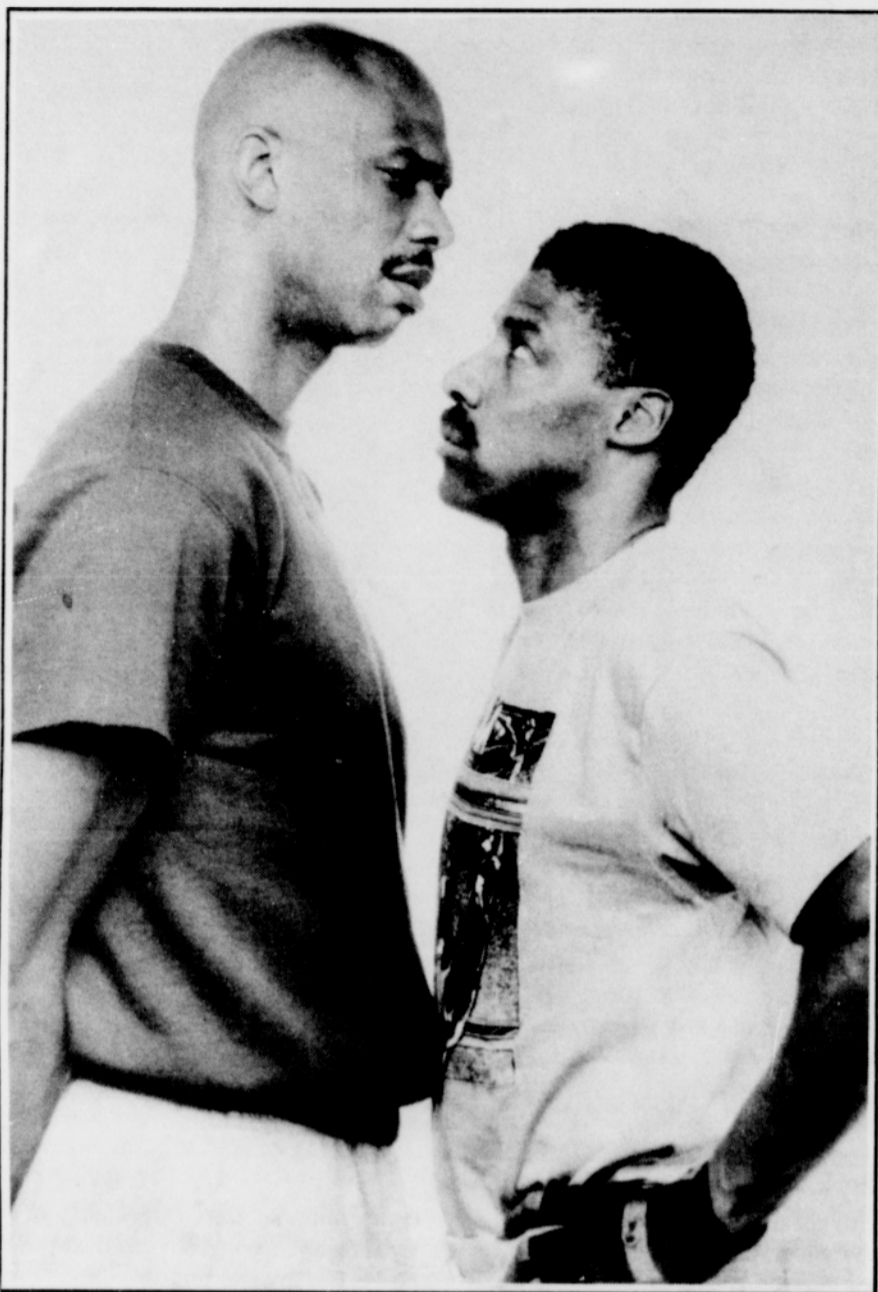


**Basketball Greats Julius "Dr. J" Erving And Kareem Abdul Jabbar To Hoop It Up In Pay-Per-View "Clash Of The Legends"**



It's going to be pandemonium at Trump's Taj Mahal Casino and Resort when two NBA legends, Julius "Dr. J" Erving and Kareem Abdul Jabbar square off in what is sure to be the hottest contests in town.

On February 28, 1992, at 9pm (ET), the former giants of the hoop will go one-on-one before a two hour televised Showtime Event Television (SET) world championship basketball game.

The two legends, Dr. J and Kareem, have some of the most impressive records in the history of basketball. Kareem, the 44 year-old former center for the Los Angeles Lakers boasts top record,

as the NBA's all-time scorer with 38,387 points. In a career that spanned 20 years, Kareem won six MVP awards, 10 first All-Star honors and was a member of six championship teams.

**Tax Planning Tips**

Are your tax files in order? No? It's not too early to start and the effort could save you time and money.

Now is the time to start gathering together your receipts, earning statements, canceled checks and other records. If you want to donate to charitable organizations or pay off some of those medical or dental bills, you must do so before the end of the year to be able to deduct them on your tax return. IRA contributions for 1991 can be made thru April 15, 1992.

While you're getting your records together, you may be inclined to throw out your older files. Wait--the IRS recommends you keep those records for at least three years after the return was due or two

after the tax was paid, whichever is later. Some records should be kept longer: property records, home improvement information, W-2's showing social Security amounts, and costs of stocks and bonds. In general, these records should be kept as long as you own the property.

It's also helpful to keep copies of the actual tax returns you sent IRS and the instruction package. These will assist you if you need to amend your return or need to respond to a letter from IRS asking about your return.
