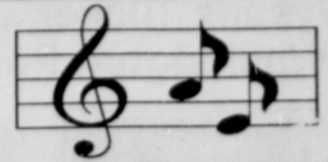

The Godfather of Soul is Nominated for Grammy--Caps Off Banner Comeback Year!!!



Once again, music legend James Brown has proven that his music is still as timely as ever. "Love Over Due, Mr. Brown's first album release in over 3 years, has been nominated for a Grammy in the R&B category for Best Vocal Performance, Male.

This nomination is yet another example of the enormous reception the Godfather of Soul receives whenever he releases an album. This year, in addition to this nomination, James Brown will be honored with both the Award of Merit (a lifetime award) on the American Music Awards as well as the Lifetime Achievement Award on the Grammy telecast.

James Brown winning the Grammy award for "Love Over Due" would make him the fourth artist in the history of the Recording Academy to win a Grammy the same year as receiving the Lifetime Achievement Award. The other three artists are Frank Sinatra in 1965, Duke Ellington in 1966, and Vladimir Horowitz in 1990.

James Brown is currently on tour. He is scheduled to perform at the Paramount Theatre, which is part of Madison Square Garden, in New York on February 28, 1992.

KATU Channel 2 and Oregon High School Student Among Those Honored for Hunger-Relief Efforts

Oregon Food Bank's Board of Directors bestowed special honors on KATU Channel 2 and four individuals for their efforts to help alleviate hunger. The Oregon Food Bank Board's annual Stone Soup Awards were presented January 29th in Northeast Portland.

The Stone Soup Award (presented as a pair of agate bookends with an engraved brass plate inscription) takes its name and spirit from an age-old fable about a village full of people so poor they don't have enough food to eat. One of the townspeople comes up with the idea of making a big pot of soup broth from a stone. The townspeople, caught up in a sense of common good, donate what little food they can spare--a carrot here, an onion there--until a fine, healthy soup results, enough to feed the entire village.

In selecting individuals and organizations for Stone Soup Awards, the OFB board looks for outstanding contributions and commitment to the common good of alleviating hunger in Oregon's communities. Stone Soup honorees this year were:

- KATU Channel 2, for their media sponsorship of Oregon Food Bank's Campaign to End Childhood Hunger;
- Joella Werlin, Public Affairs Director for KATU Channel 2, for spearheading KATU's "Help Hungry Kids"

campaign and for organizing a number of food and fund raisers to benefit hungry children;

- Frank Mungeam, Senior Producer for KATU's "Town Hall" program, for writing and producing "Faces of Hunger," a 30-minute documentary on childhood hunger in Oregon;

- Bridget Flanagan, Public Affairs Director for Safeway, Inc., for serving on OFB's Board of Directors and organizing Safeway's involvement in hunger-relief efforts statewide, particularly the annual Supermarket Saturday food and fund drive; and

- Gennie Sluder, Clatskanie High School Student Council President, for organizing the "Clatskanie Challenge" in which over 50 high schools throughout the state raised 20,000 pounds of food and \$6,000 to benefit the Campaign to End Childhood Hunger.

A special surprise Stone Soup award was given to Dana Clark, personnel director for KATU Channel 2, for five years of support as an OFB board member. She has served as board chair since 1990.

Oregon Food Bank is a private not-for-profit organization serving a network of nearly 600 agencies that distribute food to hungry people throughout Oregon and Clark County, Washington.

Dance Theatre of Harlem Photo Exhibit Continues at IFCC and Urban League

"Retrospective," an exhibit of 37 photographs tracing the evolution of the Dance Theatre of Harlem, continues in Portland with exhibitions at the Interstate Firehouse Cultural Center and the Urban League of Portland. The exhibit is on view at IFCC, 5340 N. Interstate, Mondays through Saturdays from 12 to 5 p.m. through February 7. From February 10 through 28 the exhibit will show in the Urban League of Portland's Whitney M. Young Jr. Education and Cultural Center, 10 N. Russell St. Viewing hours are Monday to Thursday from 1 to 7 p.m., Fridays from 1 to 5 p.m.

Dance Theatre of Harlem was founded in 1969 by former New York City Ballet star Arthur Mitchell following the assassination of Martin Luther King, Jr. Mr. Mitchell's goal was to give Harlem's disadvantaged youth an outlet for cultural achievement. From humble beginnings the company has grown into a world-renowned ensemble known for its blend of classical and contemporary works. "Retrospective" captures that evolution through photos

of some of the company's most famous productions of the past three decades.

The exhibit is sponsored by the School of Oregon Ballet Theatre and was organized by a local Audience Development Task Force working to promote Dance Theatre of Harlem's upcoming visit to Portland. The celebrated dance company--whose Portland engagement is being presented by Oregon Ballet Theatre and Security Pacific Bank--will perform at Portland Civic Auditorium February 7, 8 and 9.

The task force is a community-based group of volunteers working to increase the diversity of Dance Theatre of Harlem's audience. "We are pleased to be able to share this positive example of African American cultural achievement with the community during Black History Month," said task force co-chair Joe Wyatt, a former member of Dance Theatre of Harlem and currently director of School of Oregon Ballet Theatre. The task force's outreach campaign focuses on schools, churches and community groups in the Portland area.
