Sealed bids for the Portland International Airport, Low Visibility Program - Phase I, Taxiways B and X Centerline Lighting and Guidance Sign Installation, will be received at the office of the Manager, contracts and Procurement, of The Port of Portland, 700 N. E. Multnomah Street, 15th floor, Portland, Oregon, (mailing address: Post Office Box 3529, Portland, Oregon, 97208) until, but not after, 2 p.m. May 28, 1992, and thereafter publicly opened and read.

Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program:

Bidders are required to show that small subcontractors, suppliers, or manufacturers which have been certified by the Oregon Executive Department as disadvantaged, minority, or women business enterprises (collectively "Disadvantaged Business Enterprises" or "DBE's") will participate in not less than 13 percent of the total dollar amount bid.

Description of Work:

Installation of Port-furnished taxiway centerline lighting fixtures and taxiway guidance signs; kerf cutting and core drilling existing pavements as required to install centerline lights and related conduits; and installation of conduit and wire.

A prebid conference will be held at 9 a.m. on Thursday, May 14, 1992, at the Portland International Airport Maintenance Facility, 7111 N. E. Alderwood Road, Portland, Oregon, to discuss all phases of the work.

Bids must be on the bid form which will be provided to prospective bidders and must be accompanied by a certified or cashier's check drawn on a United States bank or a bid bond payable to The Port of Portland in an amount equal to at least 10 percent of the total amount bid.

Bidders are required to prequalify in the following category:

Electrical Wiring - Commercial, Industrial, General Wiring

Pre-qualification applications must be submitted not later than 5 business days prior to the bid opening date.

This is a federal aid contract, and all labor shall be paid no less than the minimum wage rates established by the U. S. Secretary of Labor, as included in the contract documents.

No bid will be received or considered unless the bidder is registered with the State of Oregon construction Contractors Board, pursuant to ORS 701.055 (1), prior to submitting a bid. (Reference Articles 10, 12, and 13 in the Instructions to Bidders.)

A license for asbestos work under ORS 468A.720 is not required for this work.

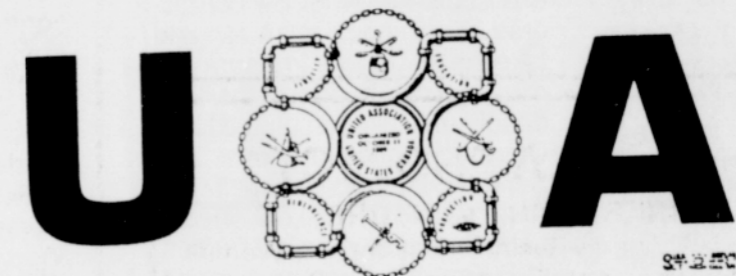
Contractors and subcontractors must be licensed for asbestos abatement work if the project involves working with asbestos.
